BADGE HISTORIES



The badge of l'Association des Scouts du Canada's District Mauricie depicts a combination fir tree and waterfalls. The colours of blue and green stand for the many lakes in the district and the many waterfalls on the St. Maurice river, as well as the abundance of trees in the area. The three levels also represent the three levels of Scouting; Louvetisme (Cubs), Eclaireurs (Scouts), and Pionniers (Venturers). The district is located in the Trois-Rivières area. R. Barlow

Scouting in the St. Margarets Bay district area probably began in the 1930's or earlier but it was not until 1966 that a District Council was formed. As part of Canada's centennial celebrations, Nova Scotia decided to hold its first provincial jamboree. Many of the districts troops wanted to attend but needed a council to represent them. Thus on April 30, 1966 the council was formed and the area was represented at the 1967 jamboree. The badge was designed by the Sisters of Charity of Mt. St. Vincent

University and depicts the lighthouse of Peggy's Cove sitting on its huge mass of rock. Peggy's Cove is a scenic tourist attraction and represents the rocks of the St. Margarets Bay District coastline. A.C. Smith



The district of York Summit is situated just north of the Greater Toronto Region in Ontario and covers such communities as Markham, Richmond Hill, Unionville and Oak Ridges. Based in Richmond Hill it was appropriate that a visit from the Duke of Richmond, England provided the design for the badge. The emblem of three lions of England was taken from the castle shield. B. While most of us have the familar red & white maple leaf flag in our collections, and some of the more fortunate have the pre 1965 ~~red~~ ensign on display, Randy Larsen writes about another version of the overseas flag emblem. Apparently the Canadian contingent to the 11th World Jamboree in Greece, 1963 were issued a flag, interim design with ~~3 red~~ maple leaves, and 2 blue bars on a white background. At the time it was thought that this would be the new design of the Canadian flag, however on February 15, 1965 the present maple leaf flag was adopted and the members of Canada's W/JAM 11 contingent were left with an interesting souvenir.

The design will be the same as the cover of the magazine and the size will probably be 2"X3".
