DISTRICT HISTORIES

CNT./OI OAKVILLE DISTRICT, Oakville is situated in the centre of the "White Oak Counties" of Southern Ontario. It is a prominent industrial centre and one of its early industries was that of shipbuilding. On a green background the badge features a white lighthouse with green and yellow oak leaves underlined by the blue waters of Lake Ontario. The border is yellow.

B.C./C8 COWICHAN LAKE DISTRICT, The Cowichan Lake (British Columbia)
Badge was designed by Scout David Hunter of the Ist. Youbou Troop.
The badge depicts Lake Cowichan in blue on a brown valley floor. The mountains are green, the sky white and the border and writing red.

\(\frac{\text{ALTA.}/\text{B6}}{\text{BUFFALO}} \) BUFFALO LAKE DISTRICT, The Buffalo Lake District in Alberta was a favourite buffalo hunting ground. The badge shows a buffalo in brown and the outline of a lake. The lake is blue and the name is brown on a yellow field.

SASK/B2 BLACK GOLD DISTRICT, The Black Gold District of Saskatchewan is located in and around the town of Estevan whose industries are oil, coal and power. The black background represents coal and oil and the gold spark Estevan. The name of the badge is printed in gold.

N.S./KI KINGS DISTRICT, Kings, N.S. District Badge takes its design from the outstanding features of the Annapolis Valley. The apple, crown and apple blossom indicate the apple is king in the valley, the open book represents Acadia University and the aircraftRCAF Station Greenwood.

MAN./S3 ST.VITAL, The St. Vital, Man. District Badge depicts the official coat of arms of the municipality of St. Vital. The beaver represents Manitoba, the fleur-de-lys the municipality's original French status, the cross Father Vital Grandin, the harp Ireland and the maple leaves Canada.

ONT./O2 ORIOLE DISTRICT, The Oriole Area in Toronto chose as its badge the bird from which it derives its name. The Baltimore Oriole, in black, orange and white, is shown standing on a brown twig.



3rd SASKATCHEWAN JAMBOREE

This jamboree was held at Little Red River Camp in Saskatchewan from July 5th to 13th in 1952. The camp was divided into 5 sub-camps for which the names were chosen from places vitally associated with Baden-Powell's life or with the history of the movement he founded. The 5 sub-camps were: BROWNSEA, the site of the first experimental scout camp; PAX, the Latin word for peace, taken from the Baden-Powell home in England, Pax Hill; KENYA, the land where B.P. spent much of his life and now lies buried; ARROWE, the site of the great Coming-of- Age Jamboree in 1929; and DISCOVERY, the ship used by Scott in his Antarctic explorations which in 1952 lied moored in the Thames serving as a

Sea Scout training ship and a hostel for overseas Scouts visiting London.

Over 500 boys and leaders participated in the 3rd Saskatchewan provincial Jamboree and some came from B.C., New Brunswick, Manitoba and Ontario. During the jamboree the scouts had the opportunity to compete in Scouting competitions in the First Aid, the Knotting and Pioneering and the Orienteering and Field Day activities. Scouts against other scouts and patrols against patrols competed for the sub-camp Award Ribbons (Fig. 1) and the chance to qualify for the camp-wide finals.
