EDITORIAL

I MUST PERSONNALLY APOLOGIZE FOR THE LENGTHY WAIT AS IT WAS PREDOMINATLY MY FAULT, I RECIEVED THE MATTERIAL FROM RENI AT A POINT WHEN I WAS FACED WITH TWO TROOP CAMPS TO ORGANIZE, TWO SCOUT-O-RAMAS TO PREPARE FOR PLUS I WAS DRAFTED TO HELP RUN A TRAINING COURSE; WITH ALL THIS AND FAMILY COMMITMENTS THE MAGAZINE GOT SHIFTED IN MY ORDER OF PRIORITIES.

AS FOR WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT FROM THE "BADGER" IN THE FORTHCOMING ISSUES, I STRONGLY FEEL THAT THE MAGAZINE MUST BE A CLUB EFFORT AND THAT AS SUCH MUST HAVE INPUT(ie. ARTICLES WANTS LISTS etc.) FROM THE MEMBERSHIP; I ALSO BELIEVE THAT THE PRIMARY FUNCTION OF THE CLUB & THIS MAGAZINE IS TO PROMOTE THE HOBBY(AND I SINCERLY HOPE THAT IS WHAT IT IS TO ALL OF US, JUST THAT A HOBBY) OF COLLECTING BADGES IN THE SCOUT SPIRIT. I 'VE HAD CONSIDERABLE FEEDBACK ON MY LETTER THAT WAS PUBLISHED IN A RECENT ISSUE OF THE MAGAZINE (VOL. 5 NO. 1) WHAT I FIND REVOLTINLY DEPRESSING IS THAT NEARLY ALL THE PEOPLE WITH WHOM THE CONTENTS OF THAT LETTER HAVE BEEN DISSCUSSED, HAVE EXPRESSED THE SENTIMENT THAT THEY TOO HAVE RUN IN TO THE SAME SITUATION IN THAT MANY OF OUR MEMBERS HAVE NEGLECTED TO ANSWER TRADES & CORRESPONDENCE; THERE HAVE BEEN SOME SUGGESTIONS THAT WE PUBLISH IN EACH ISSUE A "DEADBEAT COLUMN" IN ORDER TO ATTEMPT TO EMBARRASS THOSE WHOSE MEMORIES NEED A JOLT, MY FEELINGS ARE THAT THIS SHOULD NOT BE NECESSARY IN AN ASSOCIATION THAT PROFESSES TO BE GUIDED BY THE ETHICS OF THE SCOUT MOVEMENT, BUT WHO KNOWS MAYBE WE DO NEED SOMETHING TO KEEP THE TRADING MOVING, I'VE PERSONNALLY HEARD OF FOUR OR FIVE MEMBERSHIP QUITTING THE CLUB AND IN SOME CASES THE "HOBBY" ALTOGETHER BECAUSE THEY HAVE BECOME FRUSTRATED IN NOT HAVING THEIR LETTERS ANSWERED.

Following a morning of brisk trading of badges and stories about experiences at the 2nd G T R Jamboree in Brantford, Ontario last summer, the business portion of the meeting was called to order at 12 noon with 30 members in attendance: Reni Barlow presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were distributed and accepted.

The Treasurer-Membership Chairman, John Getgood, advised that the membership currently stands at 235 in good standing and financially there is approximately \$500.00 in the bank. There is also \$350 (assets) in the form of provincial badge sets. The catalogue will be issued today to members in attendance and the balance will be mailed within the next two weeks to all other members.

Reni Barlow welcomed our out-of-town visitors: Arnold Smith of Halifax, Don Ireland of Philadelphia and Bill Kelly of Montreal. He also made reference to the Picture Album, which has been in the works for quite some time, to the effect that in the vicinity of \$1000 - 1500 would be required to launch the project. It may be necessary to seek capital in the form of membership loans to initiate it. The suggested retail price would be \$3.00 - 4.00 and would probably be republished biannually.

Reni reaffirmed his intention of stepping down from his "editorial" responsibility as of the next magazine issue, due to pressures of his other duties. He appealed to those present to assume this function. Except for the Windsor area, the Ontario Badger section is without representation. The West and East coasts are quite active and are presently looking for people to vigorously promote Club functions.

Don Ireland spoke on 'Badge Collecting' and the unfortunate commercialism which raises its head from time to time. The bigness of some collectors operation makes it difficult for the spirit of trading to be followed. In particular 'auctioning' sometimes places a false dollar value on a badge's worth. Don didn't know the solution to the problem but felt that expressing his sentiments would perhaps make the situation more easily understood.

Reni replied that we, the Club, have tried to encourage the younger member's participation in the trading process which may offset this trend somewhat (hopefully).

On April 26th, 1980, Lakeland Region is holding their annual conference in Pickering and has asked the Badger's Club to setup a display and operate a trading corner. Any member who can attend, please leave his name with the secretary.

Mike Frankham asked that Badge Histories be directed to him for his preparation in the catalogue.

Bill Neal has volunteered his services as Co-ordinator of the Badger display at CJ 81. More about this activity will be dealt with at subsequent meetings.

A question from the floor enquired into the 'Loto Badger' contest. Apparently insufficient badges were submitted to continue the draw for the current month. There's a message there.....if Loto-Badger is to continue, it needs participation from the membership.

Arnold Smith raised the problem of a new member having only his own district badge to swap and how discouraged he feels when trying to start out. Reni acknowledged the frustration of the novice collector but pointed out that most older and experienced badgers are quite prepared and often state on their wants lists that they are willing to accept bulk trades. The opportunity does exist for him to build up both a collection and his swap box.

The meeting adjourned at 1:30pm and trading feverishly resumed.

The Next meeting will be held on April 27th, 1980 at 415 Yonge Street, Toronto.

Due to last minute complications, the site of the Badgers meeting had to be shifted to a different location, which entailed quite considerable scrambling by the Club secretary. Notices were posted with directions how to find the new meeting site. Twentysix members were able to follow the instructions and made their way unerringly (presumably) to where the meeting ended up. Feverish continued unabated until, following a short lunch break, Reni Barlow called the meeting to order.

The minutes were read and approved; moved - Don Irelan, Seconded Doug Donald.

Inasmuch as insufficient badges have been mailed in to Loto-Badger, it has been decided to terminate this activity for the time being. Members who have submitted badges will have theirs returned or at least an equivalent number of different ones from the assortment.

Joh Getgood presented a year-end financial statement for the period ending October 31st, 1979: Cash on hand \$ 31.89

Assets \$1234.01	Revenue \$1005.63
Liabilities <u>\$1399.49</u>	Expenses <u>\$ 1242.81</u>
Deficit - \$165.48	- \$ 237.18

This gloomy financial situation was somewhat offset by the announcement of Badge Picture Album, which is well in hand with \$1050 already received and the balance in the form of verbal comitments by other members. The book will be ready for sale mid-summer and will do much to swell our coffers and more importantly, provide excellent promotion and public relations for the Club. Bill Kelly donated \$70 to the Book Fund. This money was raised at the Quebec Region's last swooporee at a 'grab-bag' auction they held for this purpose.

Don Irelan suggested that the International Badger be advised of the book's availability and perhaps insert an advertisement in their magazine. A general discussion ensued on the International Club which appears to be becoming more tolerant of the existence of the various Chapter Clubs such as ours and Australia's.

The membership Chairman advised that we have a PAID UP membership of 220.

A few members expressed dissatisfaction with a 3 to 4 month time lag between payment of dues and receipt of their Badge catalogue and membership directory, etc. John Getgood replied that he currently reacts within 2-3 days of receiving new membership applications.

A Badger display at the Lakeland Regional Scouting Conference in Pickering on April 26th was well received by the delegates. They had many questions and were most interested in the collections and our organization. Approximately 65 applications for membership were snapped up and we were asked back for next year. Many thanks to John Getgood and his scouts, Jack Strachan Doug Donald and me too for manning the display.

Reni announced that Jim Munns of Vancouver has assumed the role of Magazine Editor. Consequently any and all material for inclusion in the magazine -- Wants Lists, everthing -- goes to Jim and he will beat it into shape, trim, whatever is required to make it all fit. Thanks Jim and rotsa ruck.

It was reported that all display groups for CJ 81 have been contacted -- but so far, not the Badger Club. Reni will be following through with the National Scout Office.

Brian Leathem raised the point that quite some time ago, Don Dafoe had undertaken to research methods to encourage new and younger members to join the Club and he wondered where the matter stood. Reni will follow up.

Another general item was discussed concerning 'members' who want the catalogue and magazine but appear not to want to swap because they do not answer letters or return (sometimes) badges mailed when their name first appears in the membership directory. In an effort to eliminate this problem it was suggested that a notation to that effect be included on the application for membership form which would identify this preference. An appropriate designation in the directory would be made to indicate a 'non-trading' member. Al Harnick and Morley Nokes are going to prepare an outline of this proposal for inclusion in a future magazine issue.

BILL NEIL REPORTS THAT THERE ARE A COUPLE OF NEW BADGES FROM SASKATCHEWAN ON THE WAY, MAYBE EVEN BEFORE THIS ISSUE FINALLY GETS AWAY. OUT HERE IN B.C. A NEW BADGE IS ON THE WAY FOR EAST WHALLEY, THE WAY I'VE HEARD IT IS THAT IT HAS BEEN ALREADY PRODUCED ONCE, AND SUBSEQUENTLY RETURNED TO THE MANUFACTURER BECAUSE OF A DESIGN ERROR. EVIDENTLY THE NEW BADGE IS GOING TO BE THE SAME BASIC DESIGN, BUT NAMED "EAST WHALLEY-GUILFORD" THE DISTRICT BOUNDARIES ARE NOT GOING TO CHANGE.



THE BADGE OF THE NOW DEFUNCT "HOPE DISTRICT" IS REPRESENTATIVE OF BOTH THE DISTRICT'S HISTORY & OF THE SCOUTING GROUPS IN THE AREA. THE CENTRAL OBJECT OF THE BADGE IS THE CAIRN, A LANDMARK AT PRESENT DAY HOPE THAT MARKS THE BEGINNING OF THE HISTORIC DEWDNEY TRAIL TO THE GOLD FIELDS OF THE INTERIOR. HOPE WAS A STARTING POINT FOR TWO SEPARATE GOLD RUSHES, THE ONE IN THE CARIBOO (BARKERVILLE) AND THE ONE IN THE KOOTENAYS. THE PICK IS SYMBOLIC OF THE MINERS THAT PASSED THROUGH HOPE ON THEIR WAY TO THE GOLD FIELDS. THE AXE REPRESENTS THOSE PIONEERS THAT STAYED IN THE AREA AND CLEARED THE LAND FOR FARMING OR ENGAGED IN THE AREA'S EARLY LOGGING INDUSTRY. THE COLORS, RED (ROVERS), YELLOW (CUBS) AND GREEN (SCOUTS) SIGNIFY THE SECTIONS IN SCOUTING THAT WERE IN BEING WHEN THE DISTRICT WAS. TODAY THE SCOUT MOVEMENT IN HOPE IS ADMINISTERED AS PART OF THE CHILLIWACK DISTRICT.
