

DISTRICT HISTORIES

ALTA W1 Wild Rose District This district is named for the abundance of the Provincial flower in the area and because the city of Camrose is known as "Rose City". The badge has a yellow Scout fleur-de-lys superimposed on a pink wild rose; a yellow border and the name of the district in white letters are set on a green background.

ALTA B3 Beaver Valley District This badge shows a brown beaver in the green valley and overhead, a red fleur-de-lis on a yellow sky. Dark green trim is used around the border. The district draws its name from the area it is in.

ALTA L4 Lethbridge This district badge is in red, yellow, green and black, symbolizes prominent features of the area: the CPR Viaduct Bridge across Old Man River, a sheaf of wheat - the main economic supporter of the area - and a coal miner's pick and helmet, recalling the mineral that prompted settlement of the area.


ALTA C4 Chinook District The district badge shows a chinook arch, the cloud formation that announces a chinook, and the Rocky Mountains in purple in the background. The main mountain is the Chief Mountain. There are green foothills and gold wheatfields in the foreground. The sky is blue with white clouds; the background is yellow. The district name and border are green.

ALTA S5 South Peace Alberta District This district badge depicts the Peace River by a blue band running from north to south. The background is the grey-brown of the earth. A yellow band across the bottom represents the wheat of the area. The white trumpeter swan which inhabits the Grand Prairie area, is shown. The badge is bordered in black and the lettering is green.

ALTA B6 Buffalo Lake District The Buffalo Lake District in Alberta was a favourite buffalo hunting ground. The badge shows a buffalo in brown and the outline of a lake. The lake is blue and the name is brown on a yellow field.

SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING
TORONTO CHAPTER
APRIL 26th, 1981

On a bright sunny Sunday, when many of us should have been home working in the garden or cutting grass, some 30 badgers assembled in the Saint Simon's Parish hall in Highland Creek for our spring meeting. All in all, a reasonable turnout with feverish swapping going on -- especially with the more youthful members in attendance.

The business portion of the meeting got underway at 2:00 pm and the first order of business was drawing the names of the winners for the district badges that each attendee donated as the price of admission. The winners were Adam Letho, Lynn Ellis and Robert Lewis.

The Treasurer reported that the net income for 1980 was \$642.52 and that the current active membership stood at 252 members.

Rene Barlow reported that the Club will have an exhibit at CJ 81 which will display all Canadian District badges, including many of the variations that have occurred over the years, courtesy of Bill Neil and the Jamboree Crest collection of Bill Kelly. These will be housed in two 20 X 30 marquee tents -- luxurious accommodation compared to CJ 77. And speaking of CJ 77, it was reported that the Badger display was the THIRD most popular area at the Jamboree -- Tandy crafts was first and Canada Fitness second. Bill Neil can still use some assistance in staffing the display at CJ 81. Anyone looking for a job? Give Bill a holler.

The Badger Book of Canadian District badges, on sale in some regional Scout offices (Toronto, Windsor, Waterloo and Saskatoon) has been well received and while selling somewhat less than briskly, nonetheless selling. Any member who has not yet acquired this valuable item can obtain same through John Getgood directly without having to pay the markup price that the book sells for in Scout shops.

Comments such as 'good layout, informative and professional' were some of the adjectives used to describe the members reaction to the latest edition of the Badger magazine. In short, Diane, keep up the good work. We appreciate the effort that you obviously are putting into it.

Jack Strachan reported on two P R activities that the local chapter was involved in: April 11th, Owasco annual Hobby Show and April 25th, Lakeland Region Conference in Barrie. In both instances, the collections on display received a lot of attention and provided the opportunity to cultivate new membership.

It was mentioned that GTR would be holding a Scouting In Action event in 1982, and while details were rather sketchy, it was felt that the Badgers should approach the organizers regarding a display.

It was suggested by Ed Lattimore that the Club consider holding a joint meeting in the fall with the Maple Leaf chapter on Scout Stamp collecting. Some of their members are interested in badges too and it may be that some of ours might become hooked (philatelically speaking).

The fall meeting will probably be held here again, the latter part of October or the first Sunday in November. Details and maps will be provided in a later magazine issue.

Are You Ready for CJ'81 ??



Hints for Swopping at C.J.'81

One of the many enjoyable activities of a jamboree is exchanging a badge or pin with a new friend who hails from across the province, across the country or around the world! Many boys and leaders will take the opportunity provided by CJ'81 to trade district badges to add to their campfire blankets, to remember someone who shared a great experience with them, or just for the fun of collecting. Swopping will be fun for everyone if we all keep a few simple guidelines in mind.

One of the most important things to remember is the need to plan ahead. Although swopping is a part of every jamboree, some boys are disappointed each time. Because they brought nothing to trade. Now is the time to lay in a supply of district badges. Don't neglect other tradeable items either; many provinces, regions, towns and cities have pins, flags, pennants, stickers etc. available through your tourist office, Chamber of Commerce, or City Hall. Although these are usually traded for similar items, rather than district badges, they are always in demand. Camp and event crests are often traded as well but are sometimes rather expensive unless you're the guy that got stuck with the extra 87 Camporee crests this year!

Swopping at the Jamboree should take place when it won't interfere with planned program activities. As a general rule badges are swopped on a 1 to 1 basis without regard for the size, number of colours, or place of origin. There are of course exceptions to this rule, where one of the badges is particularly expensive. A satisfactory agreement is then reached, usually 2:1, 3:1, or 3:2. Contrary to what some people's beliefs, badges from other countries are not really more valuable than your own district badge. Some are hard to get, some are expensive (especially U.S. "shoulder patches"), while many are of the cheaper silk embroidered variety. Usually foreign badges trade 1:1 with a maximum of 3:1.

Unfortunately there are a few leaders and boys who will try to take advantage of the trust and goodwill which are a part of the Jamboree spirit. Be on the lookout for phrases like: "really Rare", "only a few made", "I don't like to part with it", and "Means an awful lot to me". Beware of the high pressure types - remember you don't have to say yes! Don't agree to trade or shake hands unless you are satisfied and happy. There are 15000 other guys to swap with.

When in doubt the best thing is to get some advice—at the Badgers Club display area, where you will find a complete set of Canadian district badges and Scouts, Ventures and Scouters for whom badge collecting is an enjoyable hobby. They will be glad to answer your questions and discuss your collection with you. While it is impossible to police the many thousands of people who will be trading at CJ'81, the Club is willing to help in settling disputes involving trading.

Are You Ready for CJ'81 ??



Parts of the Scout uniform should not be regarded as trading items nor should any badge be removed from the uniform for swapping. Our uniforms must remain complete for the Jamboree and the trip home. We are proud to represent our province and our community at CJ'81. We'll show this by keeping our uniforms looking sharp and complete.

Apart from the official Jamboree Trading Post etc., badges, crests and similar items shouldn't be sold on the site. Swapping is far more rewarding anyway.






