REJUVENATING OLD BADGES

PART II



The first part of this series sparked off a lot of interest if the comments are anything to go by. I recieved only one complaint, from Peter Berry in the UK who bemoaned that his hardware shop had never heard of "MURLEX". Now there's an opportunity for one of you to go into the export business!

Jokes over and heads down for Part 2 which will deal with the gentle art of: -

REPAIRING WORN, DAMAGED and FRAYED Badges

This can be a very exacting, tedious and time consuming job, but if the badge is worth it then the results can be very spectacular indeed.

Materials needed are basically: A very fine pair of scissors and tweezers. (A tip here is to buy these from a Surgical supply shop as the ones used in eye surgery are excellent - I pinched mine off my Doctor wife but they are not much more expensive than the rotten blunt monstrosities sold in chemists and sewing shops). Another tip is next time you want an ordinary pair of scissors, try the 'plaster' scissors also from a medical or surgical supplier - they are excellent and even sharpen up very well. Anyway to get on the next item is a set of felt pens in assorted colours. Buy a good quality with fairly fine tips and in as many shades as possible. The ones I use are 'NEO MAGIC'. Next buy some cards of hemming tape. You want the iron on type which come in black, white and khaki as well as other colours. Good ones are the 'Korbond' Iron on Bias Tapes that are obtainable from most Supermarkets as well as drapers. For really big heavy jobs you can try the 'Iron on Mender' put out by the same company but for 99% of jobs the light tape is better. Of course you will want an iron and if you can find a small travelling iron you are lucky - they seem to have been replaced by enormous computerised sauna jobs these days. Last but not least - good light and a magnifier of some sort as well as the usual supply of blotting paper etc.

Most damage can be described as 'bits missing'. This is usually around the edges and often consists of fraying on the sides opposite the selvidge. The easiest way to describe the technique is for me to try and detail what I did to a very tatty South Coast and Tablelands (Bob tailed bird version) that Tony Peck swopped me at the Badgers Weekend - just after dinner if I recall, when I was at peace with the world. This badge was very badly frayed on all four sides in fact it looked like a tiny fringed table cloth for a dolls house. As well it was no longer black in colour but a very pale grey. However one good feature was that although frayed very badly it was still to size measured across the 'fringe' and was clean.

Firstly I iron it so that the fringe was straight and then ironed on a thin strip of binding tape on all four edges making sure that each thread of the fringe was stuck parrallel in its correct position. Then I trimmed the tape back so that

I now had a solid badge in the correct shape and size.

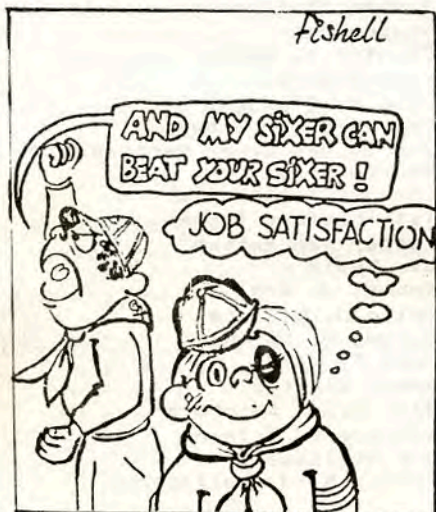
Now comes the tricky bit. The retouching to bring the colour back. In this case only black was required, but as anyone who looks carefully at any of the South Coast & Tablelands badges will notice - it is a mass of very fine detail so a great deal of care is needed. This is where a good magnifier and very fine pens come in. Some practice is required and never ever attempt any touching up unless the badge is absolutely bone dry. Any suggestion of moisture and the colour will run into the white and ruin it. On this particular badge I stroked each thread of the old fringe with the black pen and blended the new tape background into the general badge.

All very hard to describe, but the badge looks as new now and those who have seen it (and who saw it originally) are impressed - no offers to swop back from Tony though.

Felt badges have a common problem - holes. Either from moths or Silver Fish whose favourite diet felt seems to be. Answer ? Do nothing to the badge at all - simply put a piece of paper, coloured to match the badge behind it when you mount it.

The whole art of this renovation rests entirely on how much time and effort you want to put in it - don't rush - do a bit at a time - test your colours out first before committing yourself - don't be afraid to give it a go, it can be very rewarding. Never think an old specimen is beyond redemption - I had an old "Stanthorpe" that was so tattered at the bottom that half the word "District" was missing. Spent many hours on it and was very satisfied with the result. Funny thing was though, I got a brand new one a week later. Anyone want to swop a rejuvenated Stanthorpe?

NATIONAL COUNCIL

The Canadian Scout Brotherhood Fund is indeed alive and well - thanks in large part to the Trees for Canada program. Fifteen per cent of the monies raised goes directly to international Scouting development projects. Every Beaver, Cub, Scout, Venturer, Rover and Scouter who participates in the Trees for Canada program is helping his brother "Scouts" in other countries to help themselves. These funds are matched by contributions from the Non-Governmental Organizations Division of the Canadian International Development Agency.

During the period 1969 to 1976 Boy Scouts of Canada became involved with the improvement of field service and the expansion of Scouting in the Caribbean area. In 1976 we were able to react quickly to the emergency situation in Guatemala, following a disastrous earthquake, by providing tents and field cooking equipment. From 1973 to 1978 we sponsored "Operation Amigo," a project designed to improve the quality and expand the membership of Scouting in Bolivia, Colombia, Ecuador, Peru and Venezuela. More recently, we have contributed or are contributing to the funding of community development projects in Madagascar, Honduras, the Caribbean, Peru, Rwanda, the Africa Scout Region, Chad, Bangladesh, Cameroon, Upper Volta, Togo, Kenya, Nigeria, Sudan, India, Jamaica, Benin, Indonesia and Senegal.

In December 1981 we will conclude the fourth and final year of an exciting and highly successful project in Honduras which has helped hundreds of boys and girls to learn basic trade skills. These skills will enable them to become employable in the rehabilitation of their communities. A secondary objective was to rebuild and strengthen the Honduras Scout organization. Honduras is still struggling to overcome the devastation caused by Hurricane Fifi in 1976.

December 1981 will also bring to a close a three-year project in Peru. In co-operation with the Ministry of Education of the Government of Peru, the Scout Association is taking Scouting to thousands of young people in many parts of this country. From 1979 to 1981, the Brotherhood Fund and CIDA contributed a total of \$90,731 to pay salaries and travelling expenses for specially trained project workers. The money also helped to provide much needed supplies and to conduct leader training courses.

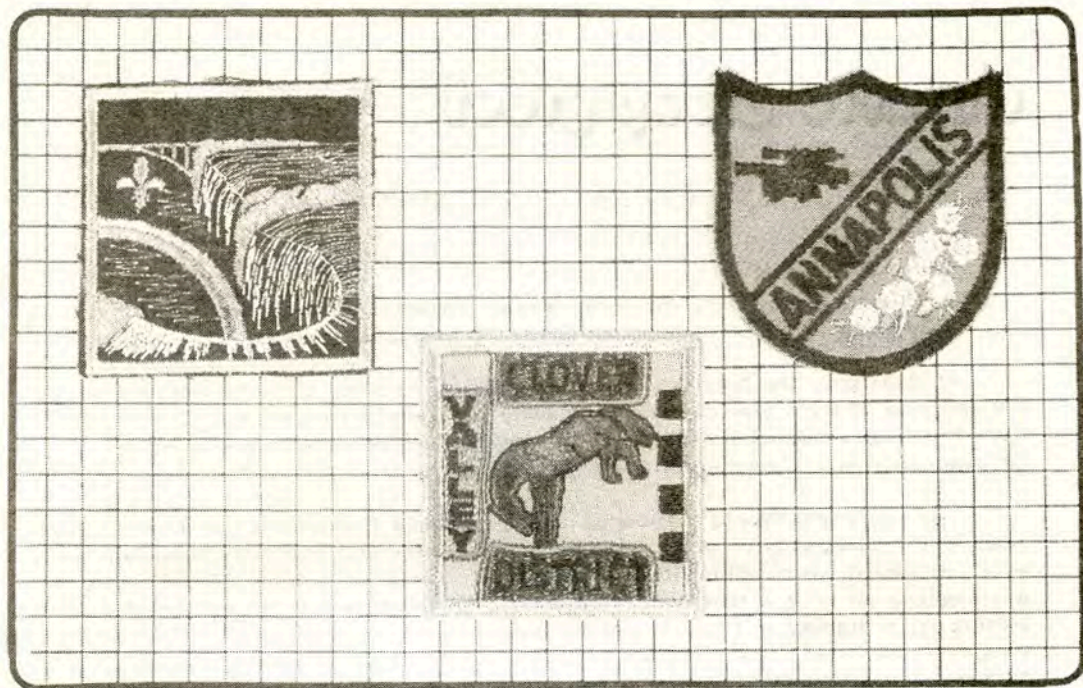
In addition to the Trees for Canada program, many groups, committees, auxiliaries, councils and individuals make direct contributions to the Brotherhood Fund. These contributions are usually the results of collections taken at B.-P. Church Services, Scout Banquets, Leader Training Courses, Scouter Conferences, Gilwell Reunions and other special events.

The Canadian Scout Brotherhood Fund has a secondary purpose which is not so widely known. That is to give modest assistance to Canadian Scout groups that have suffered a disaster such as loss of equipment by fire. Requests of this kind are rare mainly because most groups recognize the importance of having their equipment adequately covered by insurance.

N.S./A2 Annapolis District The Annapolis District badge was designed in June of 1963 by Queen's Scout Dwight Brownell of Middleton. The flowers in the bottom right section are apple blossoms, which depict the industry for which the valley area is famous. The cannon in the top left represents the historical background of the area, including such attractions as the French Habitation and the British Fort Ann. The diagonal red line depicts the banks of the Annapolis River, which runs the entire length of the Annapolis District.

B.C./C9 Clover Valley District The horse depicts the Cloverdale rodeo (2nd largest in Canada after the Calgary stampede). The three blue patches under the name represent the boundaries: Fraser River under Clover, Serpentine River under Valley, Nicomekl River under district; these are the north, west and south boundaries respectively. The four black squares are the eastern boundary, running between Langley and Surrey B.C. The border is yellow because the scarves worn in the district are yellow. The rich green background represents the lush growth of the Valley.

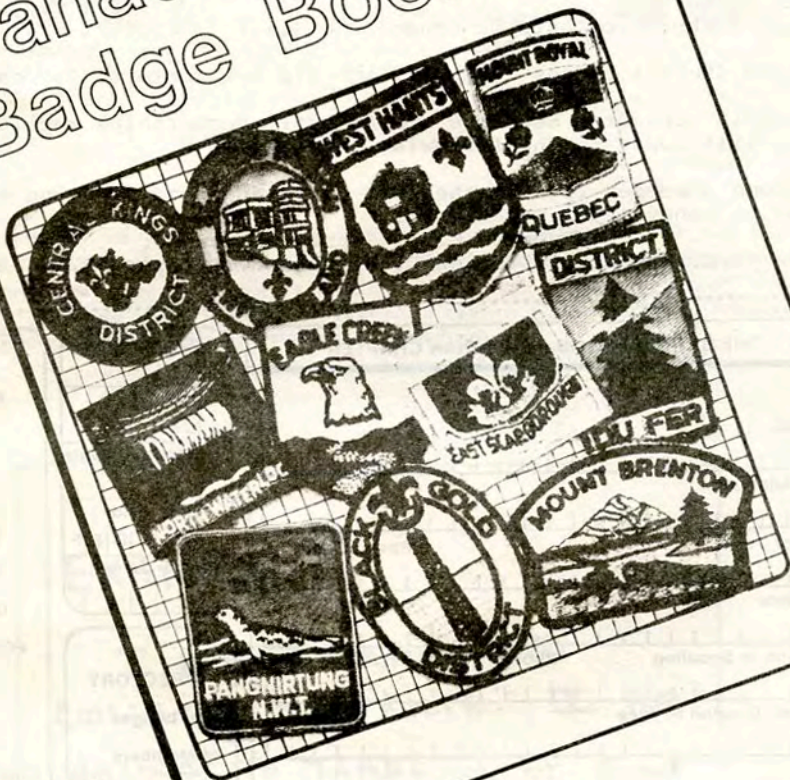
