Words From The Chairman

Dear Badgers,

Welcome to 1984. Do you realize that the Chapter is in its 9th year of operation? It's really remarkable when I look back and see the progress that's been made. Our 10th anniversary, at C.J. '85, is something few would have predicted in the early days.

One of the problems which crosses my desk fairly frequently is that of members who don't answer their mail. I offer two suggestions: one for each party: To those who send letters containing badges to every new member who appears in the magazine - Don't. Many members are not prepared for the onslaught of mail, or the expense of answering with badges. I strongly suggest that you establish mail contact with the member, before sending any badges. To those who are chronically slow in answering mail (like myself) - either reach an understanding with those you trade with regarding the frequency of your letters, or take advantage of your FREE ad space in the magazine to let people know of your delays. Most people will be pleased to see a notice explaining that you are busy but will catch up, rather than waiting in silence, wondering if their letter arrived. This is one of the most annoying problems in the Chapter: Don't contribute to it.

Thanks to all who braved the cold to come to the Toronto meeting in my basement. Although the turnout was only fair, quite a few of our younger members attended and a good number of badges changed hands.

Without a doubt, the most significant annual service project of the Chapter is the Montreal Badge Auction. Stan Rogers, our Quebec representative, does an incredible job of putting this together and until now, many of the badges auctioned off for the CANADIAN SCOUT BROTHERHOOD FUND have been his. Each year the total sent in from this activity grows; last year it hit \$341.10 (see page 30 of the Feb. 84 Leader magazine). The only way to top this is if the entire Chapter gets behind Stan and sends him a badge (or two?). Just one badge... any badge is fine (listed badges are preferred). Stan and the Montreal gang will auction the badges on Sunday, March 25th, blind-style. The bidders are told the type of badge (ie. district) then the fun begins. Most items go for about 50¢ to \$1.00 so even Cubs and Beavers get in on it. All the proceeds go to aid Scouting in developing countries. DO IT NOW... A list of contributors will appear in the magazine so don't wait.

GOLDEN OLDIES



The Humber Valley crest is designed

on a somewhat modified beaver skin in yellow.

This skin was chosen for two reasons. One, that the Indians made their picture stories on hides, and secondly, because the beaver skin in particular was the unit of currency which was used in the first opening-up of the Humber Valley and other such districts.

At the base of the skin is a wavy blue line.

This is the Indian sign for a river, in this case, the Humber. Just above the river is a group of four wigwams, the Indian sign for an encampment, since grown into Toronto - "The Meeting Place".

Up either side of the skin is a double row of small marks which are trail signs. These trails leading from the Humber, up the Humber Valley to Lake Simcoe were used extensively by Brulé, the great explorer and pioneer of this district. They were very important in the opening-up of the territory. The group of small parallel wavy lines at the top of the crest is the sign for "greater waters" meaning the quite extensive waters of Lake Simcoe.

The Australian offer to host the 16th World Jamboree and the 31st World Scout Conference, was accepted by the 28th World Scout Conference held at Dakar, Senegal in August, 1981.

This will be the first time that Australia has hosted either of these two events which will be major contributions to Australia's Bi-Centennial Celebrations.

The 16th World Jamboree will be held in December 1987 - January 1988 at an Association's owned site near Wedderburn some 70 km south west of Sydney.

Melbourne will be the venue for the 31st World Scout Conference which will be held after the Jamboree in January 1988.

TO HIGHER SERVICE

Club members will be saddened to learn of the passing of a fellow member. H. Lorne Barnewall (C0018, 1778) passed away on September 12th after a lengthy battle with cancer. Lorne was active with the Woodlands Scout Troop of Verdun, Quebec (Southern Montreal) until he was hospitalized last spring. His career in Scouting began in the early 30's as a Scout. Perhaps some of his most cherished Scouting moments include the 1937 U.S. National Jamboree in Washington, the Verdun Camporee in 1939, the awarding of the Medal of Merit in 1981 and his memberships in the Order of the Arrow and as a Knight of Tamara. Lorne devoted many years to the youth of his community; in Scouting, through the Kinsman sponsored Boys Club, and as a Sunday School teacher and supervisor. Many of his Scouting friends may be familiar with his local newspaper articles, 'Wednesday Headline' and the Woodlands Troop newspaper, 'The Squirrel', which were often included in correspondence. As one of his former scouts I can always remember "Mr. B." as being nearby and always ready to help pass a badge or requirement or simply just lend an ear to a friend. As a long-time friend of the family and recently his son-in-law, I had the task of sorting through Lorne's "Scout Room". As I did I thought about what Lorne had more of - was it badges, stamps, books, magazines, craft material or stationary supplies. But upon reflection the mounds of correspondence revealed that Lorne's most valuable and lasting collection of all was that of friendship. One of our friends has gone home.

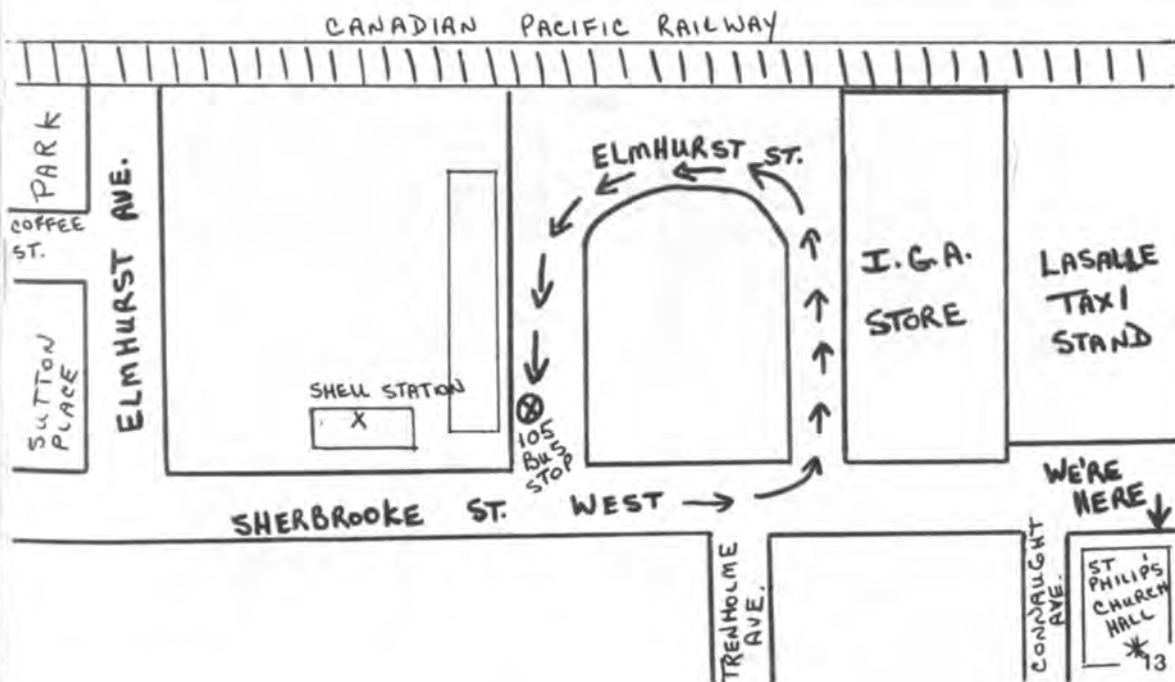

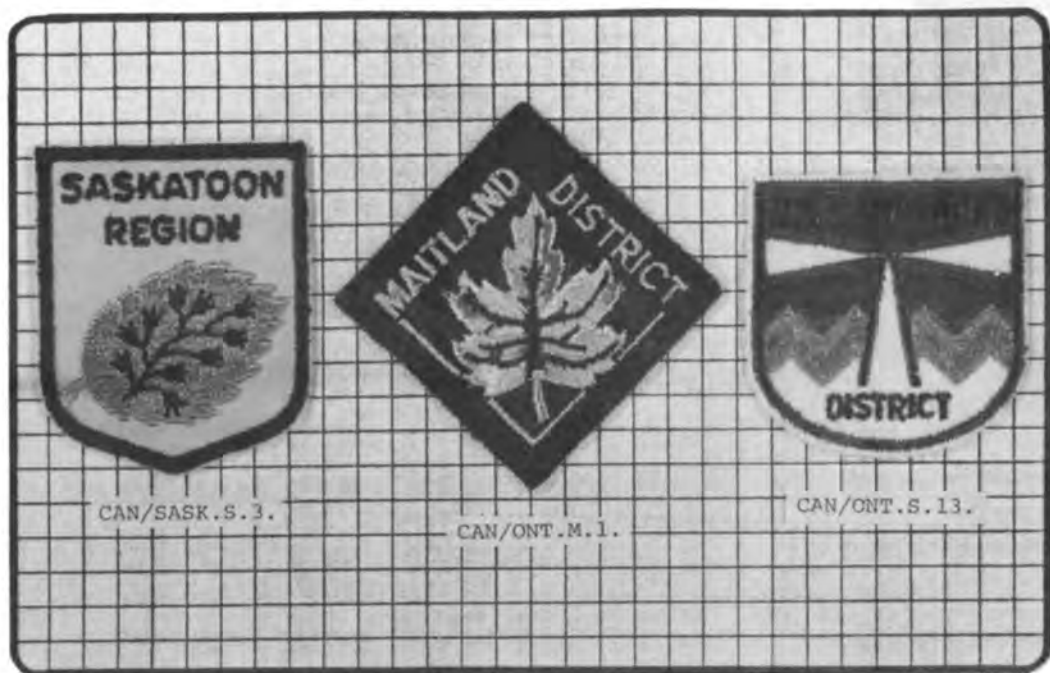

DISTRICT HISTORIES



CAN/SASK.S.3. (ext) Saskatoon Region The badge of the Saskatoon Region bears a sprig of red Saskatoon berries on a green leaf. The background of the badge is yellow with red lettering. The Indians call the bush, which is plentiful in the region, Mis-sask-quah-too-min and the name eventually was simplified to Saskatoon. The design was originally that of CAN/SASK.S.1. Saskatoon District, designed by three local Scouters and first issued in March 1957. This design was again reused for CAN/SASK.S.5. Saskatoon Area.

CAN/ONT.M.1. Maitland District The badge consists of a maple leaf design, with a tree and the Maitland River, which runs through the district, in the centre. The badge is black with a yellow design.

CAN/ONT.S.13. St-Lawrence District The St. Lawrence District centres around Prescott along the St. Lawrence Seaway. The badge shows the lighthouse at Windmill Point, site of an historic battle.

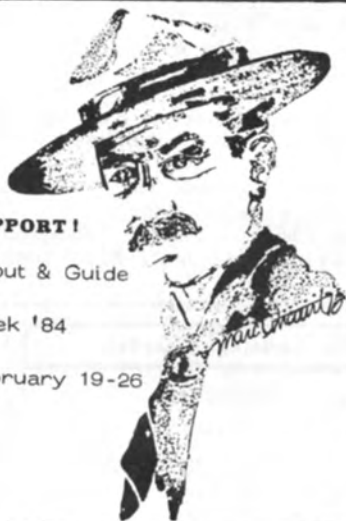
