Dear Fellow Badgers:

Well Christmas has come and gone, but for me the Christmas of '94 is one I shall long remember, not just because we had a wonderful Christmas with our family and friends, but also for what I received in badges as Christmas gifts. Just prior to us leaving for the West coast to spend the Festive holiday with our family, I received an unlisted ONT. M-8 "MSKWAGAMI" badge with vertical stitching in the white oval, then on opening the next letter, was a P.Q. S-3/1a "SHERBROOKE 75th ANNIVERSARY BADGE", on Christmas morning on opening our gifts and after spending several minutes un-wrapping the well and over taped boxes, I discovered a P.Q. P-2a "PONTIAC" badge, still on the original necker and the badge itself was in next to mint condition, with tears in my eyes, I took a second look and a third look, as I just could not believe that now I was the very proud owner of such a rare badge. I hesitate to name names of the givers, but I sure do want to express my very sincere THANK YOU. WOW!! What a Christmas.

Now I would like to say something about a few of our listed variations. As I have stated before in articles in the magazine, I had hoped to do a Part 7 book, an addendum or update to all of the previous six books, but this has been put on hold until our variations committee completes our research in many of the variations both listed and yet to be listed.

To give you a few examples and maybe, just maybe, I am partially guilty of having some of these variations listed, but along the way there was a second person involved, of who I can not name because I do not remember who I received these badges from. Now if someone can prove to me or other members of our committee that these variations do exist, they will continue to be listed, otherwise they will be deleted from the listing.

#1: ONT. B-18b BROWNSEA Swiss, Rolled edge, Square, No lakes: in comparing two badges of the same size, the same twill and background colour, the exact same colours in the badge, both have a very small portion of the background showing to represent a lake behind the smaller figure, but someone had taken a very fine pointed brown pen and coloured in that blue portion, we thought was the lake, therefor showing no lake. I also have two different issues of what is currently listed as the 'c' issue and both have a small lake, as does the presently listed 'd' issue.

#2: ONT. L-2c LYNN VALLEY DISTRICT Swiss, Cut edge, Square, Three windows, long stitching in grass, thick leaves, Various shades of blue background. Here again I have two badges of exactly the same colours and size, as well as background twill and colour, but again someone has taken a very fine pointed marker and coloured in the fourth window, another different shades of colour issue has about 2 or 3 stitches of white thread to indicate a window. Now on the reverse side of all three of these badges indicate there is definitely a fourth window. I also have five issues of various shades of colour and background twills of what we know as the 'd' issue.

Now like I mentioned earlier, please check you collection for any of these issues and if you have any of the ones in question, I would be very interested in seeing them.

#3: This is a should it or should it not be listed issue?

N.B. C-3b CHARLOTTE COUNTY N.B. DISTRICT Swiss, Rolled edge, Circular 80mm dia. "CHARLOTTE COUNTY N.B. DISTRICT", No eye in fish.

I have two issues of this badge and both badges have no brown eye showing on the face of the badge, but there is an indentation of where the eye should be, almost like an eye socket, but on the reverse side, there is a definate brown stitching, almost as if the tension on the machine was set to tight and pulled the stitches from the front to form that indentation. Should this variation be left as is? As there is a very definate eye socket in the badge. As for the 'c' issue, there is not only variations of orange coloured background, but also shades of brown in the badges.

#4: B.C. B-16a and B.C./MISC. 2b, 2c and 2/la: All are BURNABY. I realize MISC. 2a BURNABY Swiss, Rolled edge, Rectangular 77mm X 100mm: "SCOUTS CANADA BURNABY" is to large for a uniform badge, but that Misc. 2b, 2c and 2/la were worn on the uniform, therefor they should be fore-runners of what is now B-16a.

Another set of badges that has bothered me for years are the extra large District Jacket badges, we have over the many years listed the larger then uniform worn size of badges from many Provinces and Regions, but have never given any consideration to those District Jacket Badges (patches as some call them). I have my own collection of many of these, but I sure don't know what all is available.

I would appreciate your feelings and suggestions as a member of the variations committee to have some input from you the membership.







THE NORTH HALTON DISTRICT CREST

The North Haiton District Crest (1987 version) is a 50mm (2.05") square crest, the basic design being chosen after a contest. The final design is stylized in the modern concept.

BASIC DESIGN

The perimeter of the Crest is a Cow Hide shape; Inside this shape is a mountain outline with a Pine Tree, Scout Symbol and the words NORTH MALTON superimposed.

DISTRICT SIGNIFICANCE

The Cow Hide signify's the Leather Industry which was vital, economically, to Acton in the past. The colour is <u>Brown</u> which is also the colour for Beavers.

The Sky is <u>Blue</u>, as is also the lettering and represents the Waterways of North halton, all drained by the Credit River. (Blue is also the colour for Venturers.

Outline on the Halton Regional Crest. They signify the Escarpment which disects the District and was important, economically to places like Limehouse.

The Fields are <u>Yellow</u> (for Cubs) representing the Wheat Crops, still grown today, but historically a well known product of the Area, especially the areas of Glen Williams, Silver Creek, Hornby, Georgetown and Ashgrove.

The Pine Tree on the left side of the Crest is <u>Green</u> (for Scouts). Exquesing Township covers all the Dietrict. It is and Indian word meaning iLand of the Tall Pines*. Pine stands that once covered the area are gone except for the .Scotch Block area.

The Scout Symbol is coloured Red (for Rovers).
