DISTRICT HISTORIES

BY "BADGER DAVE"

- HALIFAX REGION -

PRIOR TO 1959, THE BOY SCOUT MOVEMENT IN AND AROUND HALIFAX WAS OPERATED UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE HALIFAX DISTRICT COUNCIL AND THE ENTIRE AREA WAS KNOWN AS **HALIFAX DISTRICT**. DURING THE 1959-60 SCOUTING YEAR IT WAS DECIDED TO REORGANIZE THIS DISTRICT INTO FIVE NEW DISTRICTS; THUS THE FORMATION OF THE **HALIFAX REGION** AND THE FIVE DISTRICTS OF **ARMVIEW**, **BEDFORD**, **HALIFAX NORTH**, **HALIFAX SOUTH** AND **HARBOUR WEST**.

BEDFORD DISTRICT TOOK IN THE COMMUNITIES OF BEDFORD AND SACKVILLE IN PART. BY THE MID 70'S, SACKVILLE HAD GROWN MUCH FASTER AS A COMMUNITY THAN BEDFORD AND HAD A LARGER SCOUTING POPULATION AS WELL. IT WAS FELT BY THE AREA SCOUTERS AT THE TIME THAT "BEDFORD" DISTRICT DIDN'T REFLECT A "NEUTRAL" DISTRICT NAME ANY LONGER SO THE COUNCIL CHANGED IT'S NAME TO **COBEQUID DISTRICT**; A MICMAC NATIVE WORD MEANING "AT THE END OF THE FLOWING WATERS". IE. (THE SACKVILLE RIVER FLOWING INTO THE BEDFORD BASIN).

BY THE LATE 70'S, THIS NEWLY NAMED COBEQUID DISTRICT HAD GROWN TO BECOME ONE OF THE LARGEST SCOUTING DISTRICTS IN THE PROVINCE DUE TO NEW HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS IN THE AREA. IN 1980, COBEQUID DISTRICT WAS REORGANIZED INTO THREE NEW DISTRICTS; **BASIN LAKES**, **SACKVILLE CENTRE** AND **SESPENAAK**.

THERE ARE PRESENTLY SEVEN DISTRICTS IN THE HALIFAX REGION.

- DARTMOUTH REGION -

AROUND THE SAME TIME AS THE HALIFAX DISTRICT REORGANIZATION, DARTMOUTH DISTRICT ALSO REORGANIZED IN A SIMILAR FASHION, BUT WITH THREE DISTRICTS; THUS THE FORMATION OF THE **DARTMOUTH REGION** AND THE THREE DISTRICTS OF **DARTMOUTH EAST**, **DARTMOUTH NORTH** AND **DARTMOUTH SOUTH**. PRIOR TO THIS REORGANIZATION, THE BOY SCOUT MOVEMENT IN AND AROUND DARTMOUTH WAS OPERATED UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE DARTMOUTH DISTRICT COUNCIL AND THE ENTIRE AREA KNOWN AS **DARTMOUTH DISTRICT**.

BY THE LATE 80'S, THE SCOUTING POPULATION WITHIN DARTMOUTH EAST'S BOUNDARIES HAD INCREASED RAPIDLY DUE TO NEW HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS SIMILAR TO COBEQUID DISTRICT AND AS A CONSEQUENCE, THIS DISTRICT ALSO BECAME ANOTHER OF THE LARGEST DISTRICTS IN THE PROVINCE. DARTMOUTH EAST DISTRICT REORGANIZED INTO THREE NEW DISTRICTS; **ATLANTIC VIEW**, **DARTMOUTH EAST** AND **FOREST LAKES**. (ONE OF THE NEW DISTRICTS KEPT THE OLD DISTRICT NAME).

THERE ARE PRESENTLY FIVE DISTRICTS IN THE DARTMOUTH REGION.

The Knights of Tamara

The Honourable society of the Knights of Tamara was created in 1933 at what was then known as Camp Tamaracouta, in the Laurentians, north of Montreal. Tamaracouta Scout Reserve as it is known now, has the singular honour of being the oldest continually run Scout camp in the world. The Knights of Tamara was created to honour excellence in Scouting values and campcraft skills. It was structured similarly to the Order of the Arrow in the United States. Although requirements have changed from time to time, a candidate must be a trusted and valued member of his Troop, Company, or Crew, been a summer camper for more than 2 years at the camp, be at least 14 years old, and hold high levels of expertise in woodsmanship and camping skills.

Candidates or "squires" as they are called, are nominated by Scouters or other Knights.

They must wear a ring which is painted on their face up until the secret Knighting ceremony. (This marks them so they may be observed by all in camp to be worthy candidates)

They must perform 4 hours of service "silently" for the camp.

They must carve their initials and year into a rock for the Knights Ceremonial Cairn.

They must go on a solo overnight camp on the camp property.

They must show good cheer and respect for everyone while a squire.

If a squire succeeds in this quest, he undergoes a secret ceremony where he is made a member of the Knights of Tamara and is awarded the leather thong and bead which denotes his or her membership.

To date only a little over 3,000 Knights have had the privilege of signing the great book and wearing the bead.

The Knights make up a very strong part of the fabric for Tamaracouta. Knights have reunions and help the camp in many ways during the year.

The heraldry of the coat of arms is quite simple. The red cross on a white shield is the cross of St. George, patron saint of Scouting. The oval thong and bead denote the Knight's symbol. The crossed swords harken to chivalrous times with the founding year branded on the handle. The Knights of Tamara motto is "It is an honour to be a Knight of Tamara."

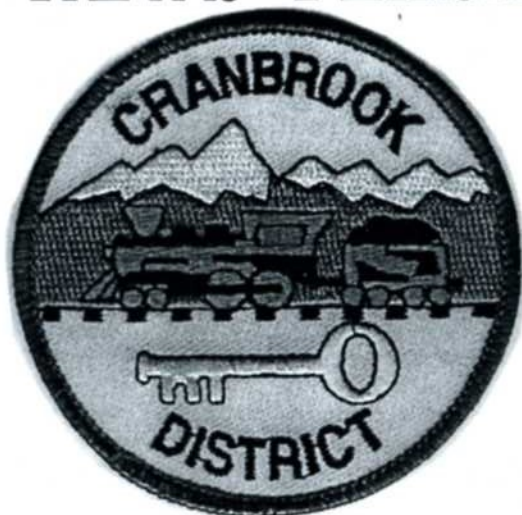



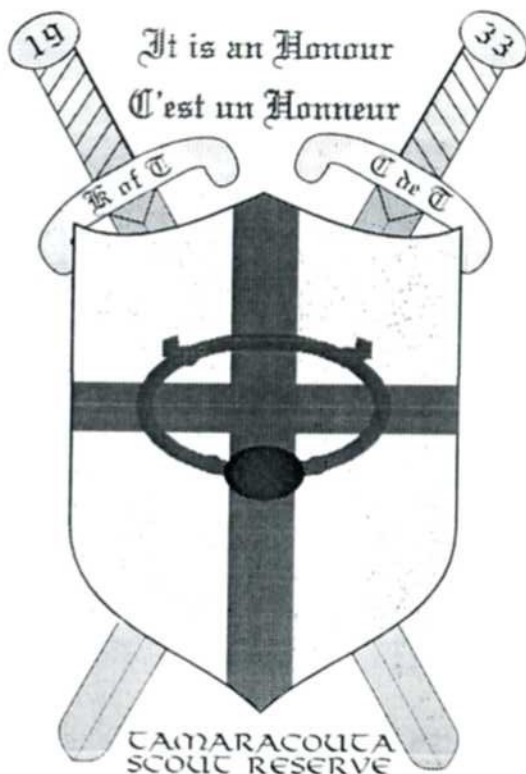
