THE MEANING OF OUR BADGE

FORM - Represents the eye of a scout. Always watching, observing.

CARTWHEEL - The Red River cart brought pioneers and settlers to the west. This is to remind us of the courage and perseverance of these pioneers that opened the gates of the west and that transmitted these values throughout the generations that populate our province. It is also the IRIS of the eye that contracts and expands as needed, as the scout who adapts to the environment that surrounds him.

LETTERS "O" AND "E" - Represent East and West (O). We are in the center of North America.

ARROWS - Are the artist's subtlety. From the center we can travel to any point of the compass.

ROPE AND KNOT - A rope is used to link or attach two things to each other. Ours represents Canada. Each extremity of the rope starts at each ocean and joins in the center of our country, Manitoba, in a flat (reef) knot. After all, our province is the beginning of the prairies and is rather flat.

COLORS - Represent the six levels of the francophone scouting (Association des Scouts du Canada) as well as other elements pertaining to our province.

YELLOW - Castors (Beavers) - the prairies at harvest time.

GREEN - Louveteaux (Cubs) - our vast forests and Spring greenness that comes as a sign of renewal and hope after our long winters.

BLUE - Éclaireurs (Scouts) - the blue sky so frequently seen and the abundance of our lakes.

RED - Pionniers (Venturers) - Our Red River and the scouting flame that burns continuously in our hearts and spirits.

GREY - Scouts-Aînés (Rovers) - Gypsum mines and other minerals of our province's resources as well as the rain and snow clouds that clean and refresh our province's environment.

WHITE - Gestion (Management) - The snow that blankets our province in winter. We sometimes forget that it takes people with big hearts to accomplish the work that needs to be done, and that they often work in the shadow of the movement.
