








BADGE HISTORIES



BC G2a

The Greater Victoria Region badge depicts the green copper roofs of the provincial parliament buildings and a blue-poled lamp. These are two of the most famous sights seen and remembered by tourists who visit this beautiful city.



ONT O.6b

The district badge for Owen Sound displays a gold sheaf of grain to represent the farming in the area, a blue anchor representing the shipping and harbour and finally a white arrowhead for the Newash Indian tribe of Cape Croker reservation.



ONT G2b

The badge of the Glenmoore area in Toronto is another of those redesigned after the reorganization of GTR in 1970. The original badge was a shield on a navy blue back. This badge shows a bulldog representing the borough of East York, three circles, the logo of the Ontario Science Centre, Governor's Bridge and the tower at Todmorden Mills. These are located at the geographic corners of the area.

- Eighth Annual Wellington District Swap Meet, April 21, 2007

A really great day attracted some 30 Badgers ready and willing to "swap and talk" the day away. In fact, when I arrived at the hall before 8:00am to get set up, there were already some anxious Badgers waiting to get in! Not a bad thing as they dug in and helped with the set-up. Some newbies and some oldies were offered and many holes in collections were filled. Swap Boxes were added to also in readiness for the Montreal Swap the following Saturday.

Thanks to all who came. I'll see you next April. Stan Fleming

- The meeting was opened at 8:15pm. by president Frank Smith. 22 members and 3 visitor were present.
- Agenda accepted unanimously.
- President Frank Smith welcomed everyone and had all attendees introduce themselves. He also
 introduced all the Life Members, including Denis Charbonneau who was present.
- Minutes from the Meeting in Montreal 2005 were accepted unanimously.
- 5. Vice President Ralph Williams had no additional comments
- 6. Cataloguer Denis Charbonneau noted that CJ badges to be listed would probably include the Participant and Staff badges along with the 9 Subcamps. Pacific Jamboree badges to be listed would probably include the Participant badges and 5 subcamps.
- International Badgers Club Cataloguer Glen Wright mentioned that the listings would soon include the 5star system for identification of rarities.
- 8. Regional Representatives BC Rep. Don Allen suggested that the Badger Magazine be printed in 8 ½ X 11 format and publish badge identification pictures in colour, like the International Badgers Club. He also announced the BC Traderee for August 18 in Langley. Other Regional Reps had no comments.
- 9. Peter Waycik, Webmaster for Canbadge.com presented his report. The website has a discussion forum, image gallery, information on the Club and links to other sites relating to Canadian Scout badges. Registered members can post wants and swaps, identify badges and CBC members can access the electronic varieties catalogue. Approximately 50 of our members and about 20 guests are registered on the site. He noted that the varieties catalog can be downloaded from here and will allow significant savings for the club when the next catalogue is printed. Peter thanked Ian MacCalder, John Butters, Anthony Palmer, Sylvain Vallieres, and Steve Kavanaugh for their contributions to the site.
- 9. Secretary/Treasurer Linda Aug presented her report and recommended raising membership rates for Canada to \$20 for one year, \$38 for two years, US to \$25 for one year, \$48 for two years, International to \$33 for one year, \$64 for two years. Rates are in Canadian dollars and reflect increased costs for production and postage. Discussion included the fact that we are not currently covering costs with the existing structure. Youth rates would remain at current rates.
 Full financial statement will be available after 30 September 2007, our fiscal yearend.
 The club will soon need to produce more badges for new members and recommended that the executive consider various fundraisers to boost club funds.
 Peeter Tammark moved to accept, Seconded by Don Allen. Accepted unanimously.
- Vice President Ralph Williams put forward the existing slate of candidates for reelection to their current positions. Acceptance was moved by Doug Reid and seconded by Glen Wright. Accepted unanimously.

11 Old Business

- New Club Bylaws to replace existing published in September 1996, are posted on the Website. Motion to accept was made by Peter Waycik, seconded by Denis Charbonneau and vote in acceptance was unanimous. Linda Aug noted that we are not requesting any backup documentation or PRC's for acceptance into membership
- Listing of Girl Guide Badges is to be worked on between Tom Evanoff and Denis Charbonneau.

12 New Business

- Ralph Williams indicated that a listing of non- catalogue items should be posted to the Website at Canbadge com and include items such as Guild badges, Jamboree contingent badges, histories of badges.
- Peter Waycik brought forward the issue of blatant inconsistencies on some of the listings regarding use of shades and sizes. Denis Charbonneau stated that items that were listed prior to his appointment as Cataloguer had not been changed during his mandate. General discussion indicated that this should be done.
- 12 Next meeting will be at the next CJ or at the Montreal Swap Meet 2011, whichever occurs first.
- 13. Meeting was adjourned at 8:50 pm
