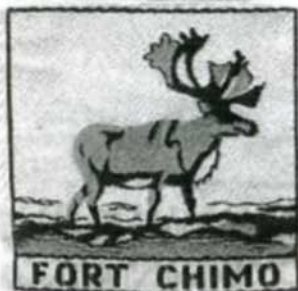

## Canadian Badgers Club Maritime Report

Our 4<sup>th</sup> Provincial Jamboree, SCOTIAJAMB 09, Cape Breton Adventure II, which ran from July 11 to July 17 at Camp Carter is now history and proved to be the best one yet with in excess of 1,000 Youth registered plus their Leaders and Officers of Service personnel.

The Jamboree Badger Display was co-chaired by Dave Winter and Don Connors who were able to recruit the following additional staff for this event: Badgers, Frank Smith, B.C., Serge Janell, Que. and Don MacDonald, New Glasgow; Scouters, Mary and Don MacMillan, Dartmouth and Stan Hayden, Halifax. The latter three names were not Badger members but all three together, had over 150 years of Scouting experience and soon proved to be a tremendous asset to our team. In addition, we were aided by Badgers, Captain Dave Rogers, Digby, Don Connors, Halifax, and Everett Dalmas, Ont., who, after their long shifts elsewhere helped in the Badger tent in the evenings. We were also visited on several evenings by Badger Ralph Williams, St. Stephen, N.B. Badgers, Chris Green, B.C. along with John Butters, Maitland, Mike Reid, Que. and Ian MacCalder, Orangedale were also frequent visitors to our site. Badger Mike always liked to make it rain badges and crests during heavy the trading sessions.

We were provided with a 10' x 20' garage tent for our display with one side removed and two picnic tables end to end plus one power cord. There were 4 additional picnic tables provided outside for trading. A large Skidoo trailer was parked next door to lock up our display and gear each evening. The end and back walls of the tent were lined with Campfire Blankets etc. We had 4 large display cases on the picnic tables in which we changed our display on a daily basis. The "easy button" from CJ07 was also a hit with the youth and those who just wanted to push it without doing anything were asked to either tell us a joke or sing us two lines of any song, which they willingly did.

Our display was open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. each day from Sunday to Wednesday and closed at noon on Thursday. As a team, both full and part time members, we all wore polar fleece grey vests with the Jamboree Logo with "Badger Display" beneath embroidered on the left front and our names embroidered on the right front. All our team were so enthusiastic during the week that we operated the display without a shift schedule, yet everyone had plenty of time off to visit other aspects of the Jamboree, go out on the tables and trade badges, crests and pins, or just go for a power nap.

We ran a "Badge Board" during the week whereby a badge / crest was stapled to the board, a \$1.00 donated to the World Brotherhood Fund and the donor issued a numbered ticket. Winner of the draw received all the badges / crests. This resulted in us raising \$155.85 which was lumped in with a similar New Brunswick Sub-Camp effort. Over \$4,000.00 will be going to the World Brotherhood Fund via Scouts in Kenya.

Beforehand, I had made a new 16" x 18" x 1" lockable case for displaying the new crests to surface from the Jamboree and within a day, had to switch to one of the larger cases because of the large number of group contingent crests brought to the Jamboree. Somewhere along the line, I feel the Badgers Club has help swing around the negativity of youth trading badges and crests at Jamborees to one of a positive thing. Our site was fairly regularly busy with youth and adults trading at all times of the day. There were no complaints (that I heard of) but only positive responses to us from the youth and adults alike.

On Thursday afternoon, Frank and I donned our Blue Badger Jamboree jackets for a small investment ceremony. We invested Mary & Don MacMillan and Stan Hayden as honorary members of the Canadian Badgers Club by having each in turn make a Scout sign and repeat their Scouter promise. With my Badger walking stick, each was dubbed on the left shoulder and given our small Badgers Club, Canadian Chapter crest to sew on their vests.

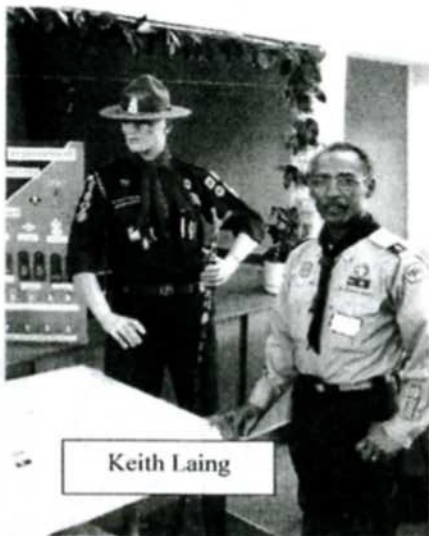


