Algonquinte Area

A Committee was formed to chose a badge name. Submissions were asked for from the Area. The Committee narrowed it down from dozens to a few then selected one. When it went to the Area Forum for approval it was soundly rejected.

They were looking for a name that reflected the area covered. From Algonquin

Park in the North to the Bay of Quinte & Lake Ontario in the South. From Napanee in the East to Colborne in the West. The area encompassed all or part of 7 old districts which was slightly over half the old Quinte Region. Lakes, Rivers, Bays, Forest, Stream, Highlands, Lowlands, Trees & Animals, Rock & Farmland.

After much debate someone suggested combining the 2 most favoured suggestions into one name. Even though many people had trouble deciding how to pronounce it; the name was accepted. Algonquinte.

The next step for the committee was a design contest open to all registered members. Again the committee narrowed it down to the favoured 3 designs and took it to the Area forum. It was quickly narrowed down to 2; but they were running neck and neck. It was suggested that the best parts of both be combined into one badge. When this was done the Algonquinte badge was born.

Note: One of the 2 selected designs was done by one of our own members Mark Adams C0983.

Everett Dalmas Ont. East Club Rep. An open letter to the Canadian Badger's Club Membership:

My name is Anthony Palmer and I joined the Canadian Badger's Club in 1988 as a Scout. During the last twenty-three years, I have been fortunate enough to have met many terrific people through Scouting and Badging, most of which have become close friends.

As many of you know, I took the opportunity to spend some time with John Ochitwa in January, 2002 to scan his badge collection. I have used the scans to create the "Badge CD" as well as full colour guide books of the Listed Canadian badges as tools to assist our membership in cataloguing and identifying their badges. I also used the images to create the panels used by the Badger's Club Team at CJ'07 for the Badge Display, as well as to strengthen the online gallery at the Canbadge badge website, located at www.canbadge.com.

I have been asked by members of our Club to allow my name to stand for the position of Prairie Representative as well as for the position of Magazine Editor, and I have agreed to stand for both positions.

I think that the time has come for the Canadian Badger's Club to adopt a fresh, perhaps more modern, look for The Canadian Badger and to publish it online. An online magazine would have a lower production cost than a printed version, as well as save the cost of postage. An online version of The Canadian Badger would also be much more environmentally friendly and would reduce our carbon footprint, as well as reach a new generation of potential collectors and Club members.

I would suggest that the Canadian Badger's Club Executive consider a lower Membership rate for those members who would prefer an online version. Those members requesting a printed version would have a higher Membership rate which would reflect the cost of printing and postage.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my time as a member of The Canadian Badger's Club and I sincerely hope that Scouts Canada and our Club can develop and grow into successful organizations, meeting the needs of today's youth.
