DANNER, Wilbert (Ted) Dr. C0093

February 28, 1924 - May 26, 2012

Ted was born, raised, and educated in Washington State, and came to Vancouver and the University of British Columbia as a Professor of Geology in 1954. He is predeceased by his parents and brother. Ted had no close family, but dedicated much of his life to Scouting and his University teaching position. As a Professor and eventually Professor Emeritus at UBC, Ted's field of professional interest was carbonate petrology. Ted was

active in Scouts both in the US and Canada. He loved the outdoors and took his Scouts on numerous wilderness adventures, passing on to most of them a similar appreciation and respect for our planet. The boys were always encouraged to leave a campsite in better shape than they found it. Many of these wilderness trips were also geological field trips where Ted would continue his research studies of the geological history of the Pacific Northwest. He educated the boys about rocks, minerals and fossils, and a great number of them went on to take courses or pursue careers in the geological sciences. Ted was fiercely independent, but lately as his health deteriorated, he was supported especially by a caring professor-friend and his neighbours. At his request, there will be no funeral or memorial service, but readers may wish to simply give a three-fingered salute to a man who left his worldly campsite better than he found it.







Greetings from the cataloguer! Once again many club members have brought new issues and new finds to the attention of me and the Regional Badge Representatives. Among those club members I have heard from, directly or indirectly, are Linda Aug, Frank Kramer, Don Allen, Glen Wright, John Butters, Steve Kavanagh, Mike Assef, Rex Moir, John Zabarylo and John Pickering. My apologies to those not personally mentioned here.

In the last column I asked for feedback on who had the BC C17a badge – the Crows Nest District badge with no tail on the crow. This was because several members had questioned its authenticity. I have heard back positively so now we know there are at least two of those badges out there. Thanks for the feedback. It gives me hope I may eventually come across one for my own collection. I have heard back about Centre Du Quebec (ASC C3) but still awaiting comments on both sizes so if you have news let me know – thanks.

This December issue marks the completion of a year-long output of new woven badges from British Columbia – now every Area in BC is in the new format, as are the three BC Council badges. There are also lots of new woven badges from Ontario that have come out in the last three months (with more coming out each week). Living on the wet coast I have a harder time tracking down new issues from Ontario than my home province so I appreciate those who have brought these issues to my attention. If any new ones are missed (and I already have a few that arrived too late to put into the magazine updates) please jot me a note or even preferably a badge with a wants list and we will incorporate it into the next issue of *The Canadian Badger*. The cataloguer reacted to feedback that the description of our new Council badges as CSP shaped was unintelligible if you did not know what a US "Council Shoulder Patch" looked like; and even if you did know then it was not a very patriotic description! This has led to the new description of our Council badge shape as being a "Truncated Dome Shape".

I also have to eat a bit of crow this issue as when the first Manitoba Council badge (one of the series of 20 Canadian Council badges) came out it was identified incorrectly as Manitoba Provincial badge 1L. It was later assigned the Council badge coding 6A but we forgot to delist the incorrect MAN 1L listing. Thanks to New Zealand member Rex Moir for identifying the duplication. So please identify the badge only as MAN 6A.

One exciting addition to our varieties catalogue that I did get into this issue is the badge from the First National Venturer Scout Event. This event was held June 30 to July 7th, 2012 at the Haliburton Scout Reserve (there is a write-up of this event in the Fall 2012 issue of *Scouting Life*). The badge illustrated was from the jamboree scarf – if anyone knows if the badge came on its own as well please let me know.

It seems that the hunt is on amongst the Badgers for new finds from the past. While a few new finds are listed in this issue of the Canadian Badger many more were examined by me and the busy Canadian Badge Reps. For the most part the differences between badges, while there, were considered minor and not enough to warrant a new variety listing.



This badge is one of the ones recently submitted to the committee. It looks to me like Manitoba P8a with a missing Canadian flag. So it might be a thread break which is what the badge committee thinks. However, if you have one let me know please. We might rethink things if a number of these badges turn up.

Badge Variations



The above figure shows slight variations in the Milton badge. We decided not to list the differences but you might want to be on the hunt for them if you collect differences between badge runs.



Here was another badge submitted to the Badge Committee. There are lots of little changes such as the airplane window, the ox, the type of smoke between the tepees. Others too but again we judged that the differences in the badge were minor in nature.



This Simcoe Phoenix badge also has minor variations. (Note the head and orange lines in the body.)

And on it goes! Please feel free to submit suspected new finds but again take the opportunity to note the section at the front of the Varieties Catalogue regarding how changes to badge listings are made.

Once again I would like to thank the club's regional reps: Bill Thow, Anthony Palmer, Everett Dalmas, Tom Evanoff, Dave Winter and Serge Janelle.

With the Christmas Season now upon us it is my pleasure to wish everyone all the best with perhaps even an interesting piece of cloth turning up in the stockings!
