## Badge Chatter

Greetings from the cataloguer! Once again many club members have brought new issues and new finds to the attention of me and the Regional Badge Representatives. Among those club members I have heard from, directly or indirectly, are Frank Kramer, Ray Crowther, Linda Aug, Glen Wright, Everett Dalmas, Rheal Duchesne, Ian MacCalder, Steve Kavanagh, and John Pickering. My apologies to those not personally mentioned here.

This issue we once again have lots of new woven badges from Ontario. I appreciate those who have brought these to my attention. If any other new ones are out please jot me a note or preferably send a badge with a wants list and we will incorporate it into the next issue of *The Canadian Badger*. 
Even prior to being cataloguer I have been interested in badge variations whether they be minor differences in a run of a badge or if in fact the differences are so much that they warrant listing. Lots of the badgers out there feel exactly the same way. I was very pleased to see such an active discussion on variations in *The Canadian Badger’s Club* website (<http://www.canadianbadgersclub.com/>) regarding the Alberta Black Gold badges.

Not only are there the common Black Gold backgrounds with a vertical gold (or yellow) and horizontal grey (or even blue) half to the badge but there are badges where both backgrounds are horizontal and others where both backgrounds are vertical. We have in this issue of the Badge Updates listed these new finds as varieties ALTA B4 “c” and “d” from the distant past. In making such listing decisions I like to ensure there is more than one badge out there just as a means to better ensure the badge is not a one-off. I also ask those who might know about the new find (in this case Denny May – alas other obvious badgers such as Bill Neil knowledge is now lost to us) to ensure the new find is not a group or a jamboree issue or whatever rather than a district badge.

As an example of why checking older variations that turn up prior to listing is important is illustrated by Ontario’s York Downs (ONT Y1) badges. A single cut edge variety is listed. In the figure below of my two colour sub-variations you will notice a thick line under the trees.



Now, in comparison a “new find” York Downs badge turned up without a line under the trees (below).



So this York Downs badge was recently submitted to me for a listing decision. In this case in my checking with the Ontario experts out there it was pointed out that the badge was a group badge and not a district badge. In this case the *Varieties Catalogue* has a note that the York Downs badge was reissued as a group badge after the district was merged with West Willowdale to form Centennial. There was, however, no mention in the *Catalogue* that the group badge did not have the line under the trees. I will be making that clarification in the notes.

We need to tap into the knowledge out there in our badging community so as time goes on knowledge of our older (and not so old) badges is not lost. **I would ask that if anyone knows of similar situations where it would be useful to amend the Varieties Catalogue with notes so the difference is explained in a note to please get in touch. This is also a good example of why it might take a bit of time to list a new badge uncovered from the past – it takes time to double-check a badge’s authenticity.**

In the last Badge Chatter there was an illustration of Manitoba, P8a, Pembina Trail. The badge in question had a FDL but no Canadian flag and I thought it was a thread break but held out the possibility it might be a new variety. There was no response to the question of whether anyone else had one so we are putting a listing decision on this one on the back burner.

Please note that Can/Nat. badge 25c (Anglican Church of Canada) is a rolled edge badge. I incorrectly indicated a cut edge badge in the previous Badge Update. The picture in the December 2012 magazine says it all. Thanks to “eagle eye” Glen Wright for bringing this to my attention. I will be making the clarification in the next Varieties Catalogue that comes out but in the meantime you might want to update your copy of the last magazine.

The figure below shows variations in the latest St. Catharines & Area badge. Our badge committee decided not to list the differences but you might want to be on the hunt for them if you collect differences between badge runs. There are a myriad of minor differences including the rowers and their oars and also the grey concrete in one of the badges extends all the way across while in the other it ends at the rowing skull.



In the last issue of Badge Chatter I indicated the Committee had decided not to list the two types of Simcoe Phoenix embroidered badges because the differences did not quite make the standard of being easily distinguishable. Now to confound us a second run of the woven Simcoe Phoenix has come out where the differences are not dissimilar to the embroidered differences but a whole lot clearer.

The committee feels it's warranted to list the two types of woven Simcoe Phoenix badges as the difference is greater. However, this has caused us to re-look at the embroidered badges and although listing is borderline it seems the right thing to do given the similarity of the differences to the differences in the woven badges. You will note this decision in the Badge Update section of *The Canadian Badger*.

Now on to history! At the Denis Charbonneau Memorial Swap Meet and Auction in Montreal last April Rheal Duchesne showed me an amazing collection of old pre-ASC uniforms with identification strips etc. that he had come by. We have now assembled this information into the ASC section of the catalogue. I believe it might be difficult if not impossible to add these badges to our collections but it helps the *Varieties Catalogue* to fill its important role of documenting the badges used by scouting in Canada.

I want to bring to the attention of the club that with Denis Charbonneau's passing we no longer have a Regional Badge Rep. from Quebec. The whole committee feels this needs attention and I would ask that anyone from Quebec who is interested in filling this role to contact me. Once again I would like to thank the club's regional reps: Bill Thow, Anthony Palmer, Everett Dalmas, Tom Evanoff, Dave Winter and Serge Janelle for all their hard work and sage advice.

Maritime Report

There is one new Area badge variety out in Nova Scotia; Cape Breton Island Area. This badge replaces the N.S.C07a and has been submitted to the cataloguing committee for listing. This appears to be the first of our 10 Scouting Area within our Nova Scotia Council to conform to the National Badge Requirements.

North East Nova Area (Pictou – Antigonish – Guysborough) submitted a badge design to a cresting company in the late fall of last year but it was rejected as the design / shape / size didn't meet the National Badge Requirements. They are presently working on a replacement which will meet these requirements.

As more Nova Scotia Areas run out of their existing supply of Area Badges, I'm sure there will be more new varieties surfacing in the near future.

Nova Scotia Council will be holding a Provincial Jamboree during the summer of 2015 at Camp Nedooae in Elderbank. This is the same location as the 1st ScotiaJamb Scoutennial in 1967. The SJ'15 Jamboree Organizing Committee (JOG) hoped to have the last few vacant positions filled by January 25, 2013.







# Eight Steps for Good Badge Swapping

## 1. What is Badge Swapping?

When you trade one of your Area's current badges for the current badge of another Area, you have completed a basic badge swap.

## 2. Are all Area/ Council badges equal?

Generally yes, so a one-for-one swap should be a fair exchange. But because of small membership numbers and small badge production runs, some Area badges could cost three or more times as much to make as a two colour, simple design badge of a larger Area. A Scout with an expensive badge might well expect more than one less expensive badge to do a swap. Whenever you are not sure if a swap being offered is fair, take the proposed swap to the Badge Display and ask one of the Badgers for advice.

## 3. What is a Variety (Variation)?

Whenever an Area/Council adopts a badge that is different in design/ shape/ material/ finish/ colour, the badge(s) prior to the new one would be considered a 'variety'. Where the only difference between two badges is a slightly different shade of one or more colours, they would not generally be a variety to most collectors.

## 4. What is an extinct badge?

An 'extinct badge' is the badge of a District/Region/Area/Council that has ceased to operate or has been merged into another District/Region/Area/Council. Because badges would no longer be issued by that District/Region/Area/Council, its badge becomes increasingly harder to find and its value would then increase to collectors. A good rule of thumb is to swap 'like' for 'like'. In other words, trade a recent extinct for a recent extinct or an older extinct for an older extinct. If you have any extinct badges to trade, get the help offered from the Badgers at the Badge Display as to what might be considered a fair swap.

## 5. Jamborees.

Scouts Canada Councils, Areas and sometimes Groups issue 'Contingent' crests for a Jamboree (be it a Canadian Jamboree or a Provincial/Council Jamboree). Swapping these should be the same for badges, one-for-one; Council Contingent for Council Contingent, Area/Group for Area/Group.

## 6. Other Events.

Crests are issued for many activities and events. Examples would include Provincial and Regional Jamborees, Trees for Canada, Council Run Camps, Gilwell Reunions, etc. These types of crests are usually of interest only to collectors who specialize in one or more of this type of crest, but the like-for-like rule of thumb is still the best way to go.

## 7. Caveat Emptor!

"Caveat Emptor" is Latin for "Let the buyer beware". In badge swapping it means to make sure you are completely satisfied with what you are getting before you shake hands to close the swap! If you have any doubt, take the proposed swap to the Badge Display and ask a Badger for advice.

## 8. Why the Scout Handshake?

The Badger's Code of Ethics for all badge swaps is:

1. I will apply "The Golden Rule" to all trades and will never knowingly misrepresent an item
2. I will return all items that do not belong to me
3. I will not trade if it means disfiguring another Scout's uniform. Addresses should be exchanged instead.
4. I will live up to the Scout Promise and Scout Law
5. No trade is complete until both parties are satisfied

Using the Scout Handshake to complete a swap not only confirms that each party is honouring the Code of Ethics, but also that the swap is being done in Scouting friendship.
