Greetings from the cataloguer! I had another great session at the Denis Charbonneau Memorial Swap Meet and Auction. It's so nice to see Badgers in the flesh after a year of emailing back and forth. Once again many club members have brought new issues to the attention of me and the Regional Badge Representatives. I have heard from Steve Kavanagh, Tom Evanoff, Serge Janell, and Rob Bowers. My apologies to those not personally mentioned here.

My apologies too, for not necessarily including all the golden oldie new finds this time around. I will tackle these once I am feeling up to snuff and not sniffing! So please be patient those who submitted something to me. One exception though is the listing of a missed woven variety from Ontario; Skyline, which we are assigning S.30.C and moving the truncated dome one to the "D" spot. How a badge from Toronto could go missing to us Badgers beats me but anyway Steve Kavanagh brought it to our attention. If you have a spare let me know, please!!

I did keep busy with new issues and you will see we have a number of them in this issue of The Canadian Badger. Also, this issue, with the listing of Fortress Halifax (NS F.2), marks the completion, at least badge-wise, of the splitting of Halifax Area NS H.10 into three areas: C.8, C.9 and F.2. This is a nice departure from the norm of combining districts or areas.

John Witham pointed out an oddity to me in Montreal and that is Carleton area which has combined the area and group badge into one piece of cloth. As it is really an area badge I will not be listing but you might be interested in them so here is an example. To date we know of 8 Carleton areas with designs like this. There might be separate CARLETON area badges but if so I understand they are not a general issue badge but instead worn by area staff. If you know more please let me know.

Now a new run has come out and the differences are not significant enough to list but as per the image below you can see the new one (on the right) has a lighter brown border and brown door and the FDL is different as is the yellow design. Now all of you who collect such oddities are aware of what to look for.

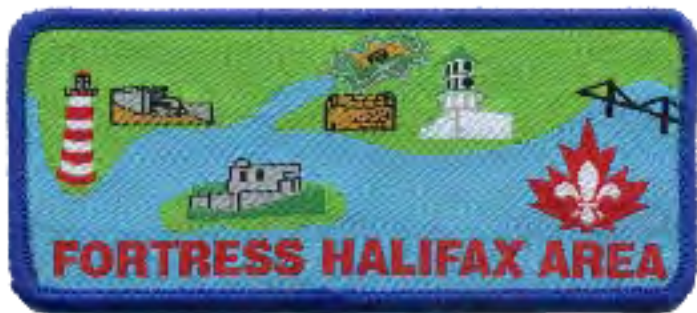
