

Badge Chatter

Greetings from the cataloguer! Once again many club members have brought new issues and new finds to the attention of me and the Regional Badge Representatives. I have heard from Steve Kavanagh, John Witham, Anthony Palmer, Will Conners, Doyle August, Frank Smith, Jim Fell and Tom Evanoff. My apologies to those not personally mentioned here.

It has been a bit of a slow period in terms of badges. This is perhaps a good thing as it allowed me to re-catalogue my Welsh collection (yes I do collect foreign as well as Canadian). It has also allowed me to recover from the efforts of putting out the latest edition of our *Varieties Catalogue*.

Speaking of the Catalogue I, and others, noticed some minor problems that needed fixing. For some reason when we added an extra column in the master document, in order to put in star ratings against individual varieties, some errors crept in. Most were fixed before publication but a few remained. Also in some cases I was inconsistent in fixing the master document vs updates. In no particular order some minor errors you might want to correct in your own copy are:

- ONT A.8 Ashbridge is missing the code letters and star ratings. Put in A, B, C in the obvious sequence and one star against each variety.
- ONT B.13/1 Brant 100th anniversary is missing the “/1”.
- ASC notes are incorrect for some of the issues.
 - A6, C6, F5, and S10 merged to form O12. Some of the notes are incorrect. This is the correct merger.
 - A10, C3 and E2 merged to form E8. Some of the notes are incorrect. This is the correct merger.
- AABP M2D is not “D” but a note!
- There are some typos here and there that I have fixed – if you find any let me know and if I have not caught them will do so and they will be seen by you when the next Catalogue comes out. An annoying one, at least for me, was Kerrisdale Centennial (BC K.10) which was missing the last “e” in Kerrisdale – a gremlin must have done this as this listing was not touched since the previous edition and that edition had the correct spelling!

I hear there is finally might be a National 100 Years of Cub Scouts badge out. This badge has not yet made it to the West Coast so I will not be listing yet. (I am reluctant to list based on just a picture as I want to ensure the description whether swiss weave, woven or printed etc. is correct and it is hard to be sure without the actual badge.) Also lately there are examples of “official” and “unofficial” badges being issued by Scouts Canada. So when I get one, and sort it out, it will be listed.

Not long ago Central Escarpment Council received a new run of badges (ONT 3). With modern badge production methods you expect badges that look the same but a different manufacturer was used in this case and there are some noticeable differences; albeit of a minor nature. These are too limited for another listing but I am showing the differences here in case you want to hunt the new one down!

The new badge is very “clean” with a simple rock on each side of the canoe and the trees look hand planted. It turns out this is currently being worn by scouts in Thompson and as the Service Area badge replaced Thompson some time ago I am concluding it is a group badge. Luckily it is easy to tell apart from the district badge.



By the way it would appear from the Manitoba Council website that Manitoba Service Areas are all extinct and some have been merged. Until badges are actually out I will delay listing. That is why only the Service Area associated with WESTMAN is listed as extinct in this issue. Note that we have previously listed Service Areas 8 (MAN S.17) and 9 (MAN S.18) extinct as well.

National has issued an anniversary strip for 2017 (the 150th anniversary of confederation). Also issued is a commemorative set of the 1967, 2007 and 2017 anniversary strips. All the badges in the commemorative strip are different from the official badges and I have amended the official catalogue descriptions so they can be distinguished (see this month's listing for the 2017 strip to see what I am talking about). Amongst other differences the commemorative set has gold lurex threads in the 1967 and 2017 maple leaf and scout emblem and the 2007 commemorative strip has a centre line in the scout emblem whereas the listed one does not. I also hear a "special" 2017 strip is available from Ottawa with a gold lurex border – but I have not seen it.


