## Badge Chatter

Greetings from the cataloguer! Once again many club members have brought new issues and information on older badges to the attention of me and the Regional Badge Representatives. I have heard from Steve Kavanagh, Don Conners, John Witham, Anthony Palmer, Jack Welsh and Frank Smith. My apologies to those not personally mentioned here.

One of first things you will note in the listings is that SASK L2B (Lake Athabasca) which was listed not too long ago has been delisted. It turns out that in early 1979 Northern Region (which that district was part of) had reproduced the badges from all the extinct Northern Region districts to try to rein in the auction prices on extinct issues and as a Region fundraiser (the reproduced badges were originally sold for \$1.00 each). In the case of Lake Athabasca besides the letters being bigger the back of my badge is mesh with a "glitter" appearance. The production of these badges was noted in issue Volume 4, Number 3, March/April 1979 of The Canadian Badger; check out page 10 on our website. (Thanks to Anthony Palmer our intrepid historian for noticing.) Other districts that were reproduced include Beaver Hill, Dunvegan, Lesser Slave Lake, Landing Trail, Many Lakes, North Peace, Victoria Trail, Whispering Hills, Gas Line, Mackenzie Delta, Great Slave Lake, Keewatin and Alberta Lone Scout. I know Great Slave Lake Region (NWT G1-D ish also has the glittery back.






