Dear Fellow Badgers,

Well here it is: the penultimate issue of The Canadian Badger with yours truly as Editor. It has been an exciting ride with all of you and I hope that you have enjoyed the magazine. I cannot lie: it is not an easy job. Many hours are spent planning the layout, putting in submissions and making sure everything fits.

I used the last (sometimes second last) Friday before the first day of the issue month as the cut off day to make sure the magazine was on time and I stuck to it. Once the magazine was entered into the postal stream and then e-mailed, I always got started on the next issue as soon as I could. I never wanted an issue to be late and I am proud that I held up my end of that promise to you, the members.

The style and format of the magazine I went with was a complete change from the previous magazine. The old style had been produced since the early 1980s. Not to take away from those issues but my having the luxury of an Adobe suite of programs to work out images, create pages and storyboards, and a scanner to put mailed items into the magazine contributed greatly to this magazine. E-mail is also a vital tool. Edits and re-edits appearing in an inbox almost instantly. It would have been a lot different without those computer programs at my disposal.

With my resignation as Editor and Prairie Region Representative also comes my departure from the Canadian Badger's Club. I joined the Canadian Badger's Club as a 14 year old Scout, and when the September issue comes out I will be on the cusp of turning 44. I had the good fortune to know many people from all across this great land and around the globe, to call all of them friends and consider a few as family. Some of those folks have moved on from Scouting and Badging, and others have Gone Home. There are truly too many people to list here. I honestly do not believe I would be the same person I am now without your influence and friendship.

There are some things I have very proud of that I was able to do as a Club member:

- The first was working with the Badge Display at CJ'97. I have my Jacket with the giant embroidered badger on the back, and awesome wood name tag (from Scouter Moe Blaquiere) on display in my Badge Cave. Those fine Badgers I worked with gave me the opportunity to learn about the Badge Display operations and to hone my knowledge about our badges.
- Next would be scanning John Ochitwa's badge collection at his home in Powell River, BC in January, 2002. This was after CJ'01, after he bought Badger Bill's collection, and after he spent hours cleaning the fine red P.E.I. dust out of his display. Those scans have been on two Club Galleries, two sets of full colour badge books, and I think at least five editions of the Badge CD.
- Another was being allowed to create the complete catalogue badge display and current issue map display, printed on heavy matte vinyl in full colour. Denis Charbonneau had bought and was in possession of the now late Johnny O's collection. There was great need for a badge display for CJ'07 so my advantage of working at a photographic/sign/printing supplier brought the costs way down (remember this was cutting edge in 2005-2006!). I was able to get all these display panels printed and shipped to Denis in time for the Jamboree. Those panels have gone across Canada several times, been to several Jamborees and are always exciting to see. I also created the current display panels for CJ'13 and the ones you will see at CJ'17 had my hand in their creation too.
- The fourth thing I am most proud of is that I was able to spend time and learn about badges from my older friends. For me it was not about the having as far as badges were concerned; I wanted to learn about the past and the history as much as possible. I have always been a history person and I enjoy seeing where something came from, and that extended into my badges and badge knowledge (my Canadian geographical knowledge can be credited to badges as well).

There are more, but if I shrink the typeface further it will be impossible to read!

So that's it. Fifteen of Sixteen issues of The Canadian Badger under my belt. I think you enjoyed reading them as much as I enjoyed producing them. I hope the next Editor (whomever he or she may be) can take the magazine as their own and build on the successes of the past 42 years worth of Editors who came before. It is with a sense of melancholy that I sign off on my second-to-last Editorial. Thank you to everyone. Without your input, the magazine and the Canadian Badger's Club would not be what it is.

Your new Editor will be announced in the September issue, so stay tuned!

As this is the third time that we have found ourselves in the position of having more than one candidate vying for a position within the club, a reminder of election rules:

1. No nominations from the floor will be accepted the day of the meeting.
  2. The vote will be by a prepared secret ballot.
  3. Mail in votes by members unable to attend as advertised in the June club magazine, will be counted along with ballots filled out at the meeting.
  4. A member in good standing of the club has been chosen by the president and vice-president from the membership present in an attempt to locate an unbiased member to count the votes.
  5. The candidates or their designate will be allowed to observe the count, but not to participate in the actual count.
  6. The count will take place in a separate area from the meeting area.
  7. Each present candidate will have two minutes to speak before the vote is taken as well as each absent candidate will be allowed to have a short note read if required. Challenger first, incumbent last.
  8. I have appointed Ralph Williams with his many years of local political experience as "Parliamentarian" whose role would be to point out standard practices and recommend, privately or publicly, a course of action, should it be required.
  9. The president will announce the winners but not the actual vote count.

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## **The Nova Scotia Council Remembers The Battle of Vimy Ridge 1917 - 2017**

On Saturday, April 1, 2017, a number of Scouts, Venturers and Rovers from across the Province were invited to meet at C.F.B. Halifax Curling Club from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. to make a number of plain wreaths similar to the ones seen at Christmas time.

On Sunday, April 9, 2017, all sections, Beavers, Cubs, Scouts, Venturers, Rovers and Scouters from across the Province were invited to meet at the War Memorial at Grand Parade, City Hall, Halifax at 1:00 p.m. for VIMY DAY. Nova Scouting members laid these wreaths in an 100th Anniversary Ceremony to commemorate the World War I Canadian soldiers who made the ultimate sacrifice in France.

Similar services were held at the same time all across Canada. Those Scouting members who participated in VIMY DAY were given a crest. The crest is not intended for uniform wear but as a Campfire Blanket souvenir item.

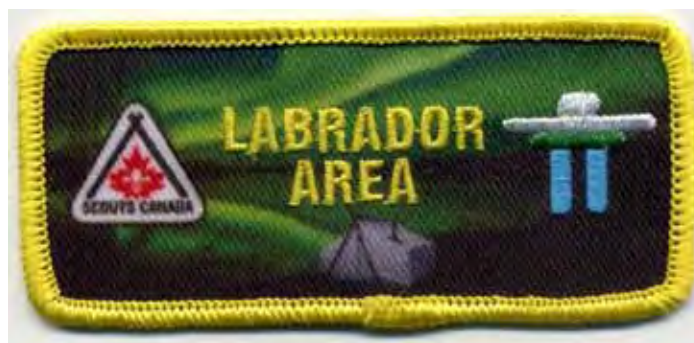

Greetings from the cataloguer! Once again many club members have brought new issues and information on older badges to the attention of me and the Regional Badge Representatives. I have heard from Don Conners, John Witham, Michael Diegel, John Pickering, Will Conners, Mike Assef, Gary Manns and Jack Welsh. My apologies to those not personally mentioned here.

Most of the new issues in this June 2017 edition of the magazine are pretty clear but I am enclosing a scan of ALTA H4B and C together so you can see the difference since this is another example of a new issue of a badge which sneaks into our listing criteria.



One new badge, NL Labrador Area, needs more information prior to listing. This badge replaces Labrador Region (NL L1) and Lake Melville (NL L2). So, it might be listed as NL L3. But if Lake Melville also used the Labrador Region badge (i.e. a true Region) then the listing would remain L1 as the same area is involved. It is taking time to track this down.



There are several new finds in this issue of the mag. The listings in the magazine describe the new finds but most are quite common and it is possible some collections have the new finds but

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not the previously listed badge or *vice versa* so what follows are images of both the new find and the one like it where it will help with identification.

There were also some new runs of badges that while different did not meet the criteria for a new listing. Two such badges are ALTA North and South Prairies to Rockies (N14A and S17A).

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I am only showing ALTA N14A as changes to the other badge are the same. If you take a close look at the scan you can see the new run is more vivid with darker writing of "Prairies to Rockies" and minor differences in the gray hills and brown cows. So for those of you who collect such items now you know!

There has been a new run of the National 20A badge (SCOUTS CANADA HONG KONG). The differences are too minor to list but the purple is darker, the blue background has more blue and less gray and the backing (not that we care) is plastic covered while the original is felt-like. "SCOUTS CANADA" is also somewhat bigger on the new run.



There might also be a new ALTA Southern Trails badge out but I do not have enough information on it yet.

Mike Assef is enjoying his retirement going through what must be bins of badges looking for differences; and he is finding them! The Metropole new find (AABP M2D) is a case in point. Another interesting badge he sent my way is a variation on NWT 2A. NWT 2A has "2000" on it which is the year the badge came out. Mike has one that says "2001". I have never seen anything like it, nor Anthony Palmer, who has a superb NWT collection. Anyway, it might be a CJ 2001 contingent badge. If so, we will not list nor of course even if it is not a CJ badge we not list until we are sure what it is. Does anyone know for sure?

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Once again there are other interesting badges that do not qualify for listing. One in this last period that I like is the Vimy Ridge badge from Nova Scotia (now if it were a National issue who knows; it might have gotten listed!).



Last issue there was a wrong description for the Coho badge BC C23B and C. Sorry about that; the catalogue has been fixed and the correct description follows:

- C.23 COHO AREA [6-FV]
- A) Swiss, Rolled edge, Diamond. [TCB-29/4]
  - B) Woven, high definition, backed and bound, red writing and maple leaf, rectangle. Area name 69mm. "COHO AREA". [TCB 37/2]
  - C) Woven, high definition, backed and bound, dark red writing and maple leaf, rectangle. Area name 66mm. "COHO AREA". [TCB 42/1]

In closing I happened to notice a discussion on NS 1F on the club website where some of the provincial badges had lines on the cross and others did not. As far as I know this has not made it to the Maritime badge rep in any formal way, nor to me. There have been other examples like
