Badge Chatter

Greetings from the cataloguer! Once again, many club members have brought new issues and information on older badges to the attention of me and the Regional Badge Representatives. I have heard from John Witham, Steve Kavanagh and Ursula Page. My apologies to those not personally mentioned here.

Things have been relatively quiet this quarter which is a good thing as I was travelling and then not feeling one hundred percent.

There were two new finds and they are described in the catalogue updates but what follows are pictures of the old badge and new find so you can better understand the differences. First off is the ONT A10 A and new find B Albion Mills (on the right). I think both are pretty common but very distinct.



Probably just as common are the ONT Y5 Yellow Briar badges with the larger "A" and separated flower petals on the left and the smaller "new find" with the joined flower petals on the right.



The Labrador Area badge from Newfoundland Labrador was finally listed and I gave it the L1B designation. Information was incomplete but in both cases the badge covers all of Labrador so it makes sense to me and hopefully you.

Another interesting badge turned up which I will not be listing as it was either an error badge or rejected badge. This is Odawa (shown below). It was for sale as an area badge in the Scout Shop for a short time until it was determined the Area did not order it and did not want it and would not use it! So, I will mention this “reject” in the listings so you know it exists and so if it turns up years from now all will know its status.



The following is a badge that has raised many questions from time to time and I thought I would raise them again! According to Antony Palmer the late Badger Bill thought the following should be the first Newfoundland Labrador jamboree badge but it was not listed. According to Bill this was simply because it was not called a jamboree but instead a camporee. If all of Newfoundland was invited (and perhaps more) and it lasted more than a few days it probably meets the criteria. Does anyone know more about this?

I thought I would take a bit of time to show off some of my non-listed badges that I hold dear. There has been lots in the news the last few years about Queen Elisabeth II and shown below is a necker badge from the Canadian Contingent that attended her Coronation way back in 1953.

As a British Columbian one must hold the Sasquatch or Big Foot or Zunaqua, if you prefer, in high regard. In my case a former relative even authored a number of books on the subject. So I like the two badges shown below. One a “Camp Byng” badge from 1979 (there is a yearly series from 1968 to the present and, yes, I have them all). The other is an old BC Moot badge.



I hope others also collect oddities as your collection is your collection and you can put anything you want into it! Not just listed badges.

BADGE HISTORIES

The Burlington (Ontario) badge shows the head of Joseph Brant, Chief of the Mohawk Indians tribe which was closely associated with the early history of the area. The badge is bright red with white lettering. The Indian appears in brown, black, yellow red and white.



The badge of this BC District depicts the Comox Glacier, a central landmark visible from all parts of the District. The foreground represents the waters of the Straits of Georgia. The background is the blue grey with a light blue sky; mountains are white and grey above grey water. The name appears in white lettering on a dark blue background.



Miramichi (NB) District's badge is green with two fish outlined in red, symbolic of the local fishing industry. The tree, also in red, represents the District's great lumber industry. The name appears in red below the yellow Scout fleur-de-lis.
