Greetings from the cataloguer! This issue I have also heard from several badgers about new or old issues including Linda Aug, Mike Assef, Don Connors, Chris Wootton, George Cartwright, Ursula Page, Marc Couturier, Rheal Duchesne, Glen Wright and Rob Bowers. My apologies to those not personally mentioned here.

Many of the above contacts were at the Denis Charbonneau Memorial Swap Meet and Auction held in Montreal. It was the best event in years and I had a blast meeting folk and trading badges. If you have not been, might I suggest you make it a point to go next year

CHANGE IN LISTING CRITERIA:

Rather than start off talking about listing badges I have decided to start off talking about changing listing criteria and delisting badges! Our published criteria on difference in badge size or internal details have stood up for many years as one of several reasonable ways to make decisions on listings. With the new woven badges coming out this is falling by the wayside. In the last issue of *The Canadian Badger* we listed River's Edge Area, ALTA R6B, based on size criteria. It has since become apparent that even in the same batch of badges received from suppliers that there are differences in dimensions. Why with modern techniques this happens is a mystery (or at least I am going to leave it at that). Rob Bowers did a good analysis of the River's Edge sizes and based on this we are delisting ALTA R6B and instead refer to size variations in ALTA R6A. Furthermore, I am not going to use the old size criteria to determine new listings. At this point in time I do not want to make a premature decision by announcing a new size-listing criteria. Certainly, badges that are sufficiently different in size that you can determine it without the aid of a measuring device will get listed as has happened this issue. But I want to think about this more before we set a specific new size criteria. If you think a new badge should be listed or have any thoughts on size criteria please get the information to me.

Also, at this point I am only making decisions on 2018 and onwards. If you think there is a problem with any of the new woven badges and size criteria pre-2018 please let me know with details.

CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER DAY SAINTS (LDS):

In early May I and other registered Scouters I know received correspondence from Scouts Canada that "...the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints has recently announced that they will no longer participate in the Cub and Scout Programs with Scouts Canada, effective December 31, 2019.". Stay tuned as to what this means to Areas, and their badges, in Alberta let alone the strength of Scouting in Canada.

OTHER ITEMS:

As always seems to happen at Montreal a number of interesting badges turned up.

A Peguis badge was one badge I picked up there with an unknown provenance. It is, however, almost certainly a scout badge. I talked to John Zabarylo about it and he has one on a Manitoba Scout Blanket. He also has one mounted in a frame. Whether it was a test badge or a very early district badge or something else is not presently known. Does anyone know anything about it?



Don Connors had a spare Anglican badge for me which I will call CAN/NAT 25X for now. All other Anglican badges have a red, rather than white, border.



Linda Aug showed me this interesting Remembrance Day Parade badge from 2017. As far as I can make out it is limited to the North Shore Area near Vancouver. Since it is not a National badge we will not list it. I would love to get one though!

A few Ontario badgers had a slight variation in the Nepean Area badge. In the new badge the Scout Emblem is a light yellow rather than the more vivid yellow of the original issue of the badge. I will change the listing to reflect the variation in colour of the Scout Emblem. I thought it deserved showing this badge though as many badgers might well be interested in it. Thanks to Ursula Page for digging one up for me!



Glen Wright had one of the most interesting badge from my perspective. It appeared to be an Ontario provincial badge somewhere near the war era given its background. The badge, however, had an embroidered design. Glen will see what he can dig up on the badge. Does anyone know anything about it?

The badge depicts Eaglehills Creek (light blue) and Eagle Hills (green) surmounted by a white eagle. The name is green on an orange background



The Pioneers' Memorial Tower, located near Doon, is shown in the centre of the South Waterloo(Ont.) District badge – a reminder of the spirit and courage of the early settlers. In the background are pictured industry and agriculture, both important in the district, symbols of the challenge to today's young pioneers



White thunderbird (symbol of the Six Nations Indian Tribes) surrounded by symbols of the clans of the Huron Tribe. The bear, the rock, the deer and the cord (sinew and awl) all on a red background. 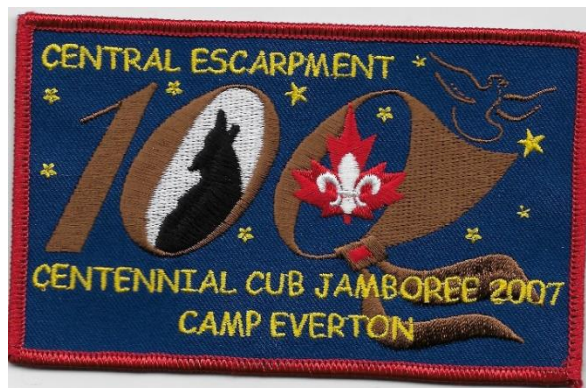
