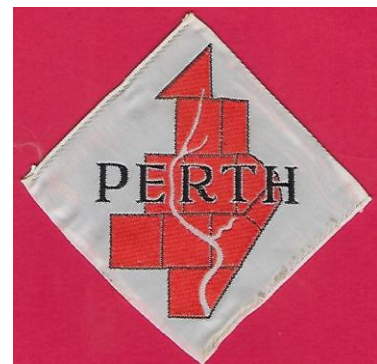

Badge Chatter

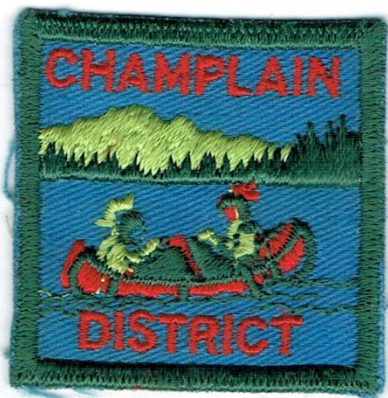
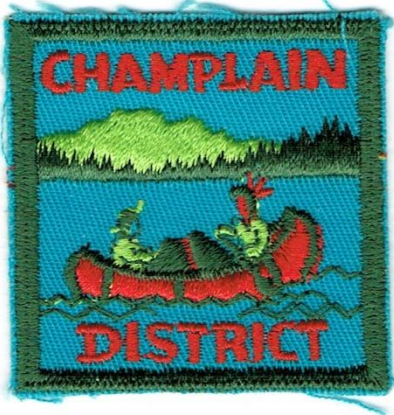
Greetings from the cataloguer! This issue I have heard from Peeter Tammark, Michael Diegel and Steve Kavanagh regarding new finds.

We have two new listings this issue, both National and both extremely interesting and unique for our Catalogue. The first is a small Canadian flag badge. What is interesting is the badge was sewn on the uniform by the manufacturer (and to emphasise it is not embroidered on so it is a legitimate badge). This means, that to my knowledge you need to pick the badge off a uniform or shirt if you want to put it in your collection as opposed to purchasing one in the Scout Shop. The second listed badge is also unique, at least for the modern period, in that it is a United Kingdom badge authorised for use by Scouts Canada on our uniforms. Pictures are in the listings of both these badges.

I will be adding a number of notes to the catalogue. These relate to many badge differences that Peeter Tammark brought to my attention. All the badges were different but not different enough that they constituted different varieties in the catalogue according to me and also the Regional Reps. Here are some of them that you might be interested in looking for.



The BC Queen Charlotte Islands badge (BC Q.1.B.) has either small or big letters. Although it does not show in the scan the fishtail is also different; unidirectional versus multi directional. The size of lettering differs for many other Canadian badges as well.



The Champlain (ONT C.1.B.) has different shades as recognised in the catalogue. But the level of the canoe in the water differs as do the paddles as well. But not enough of a difference for a new listing.

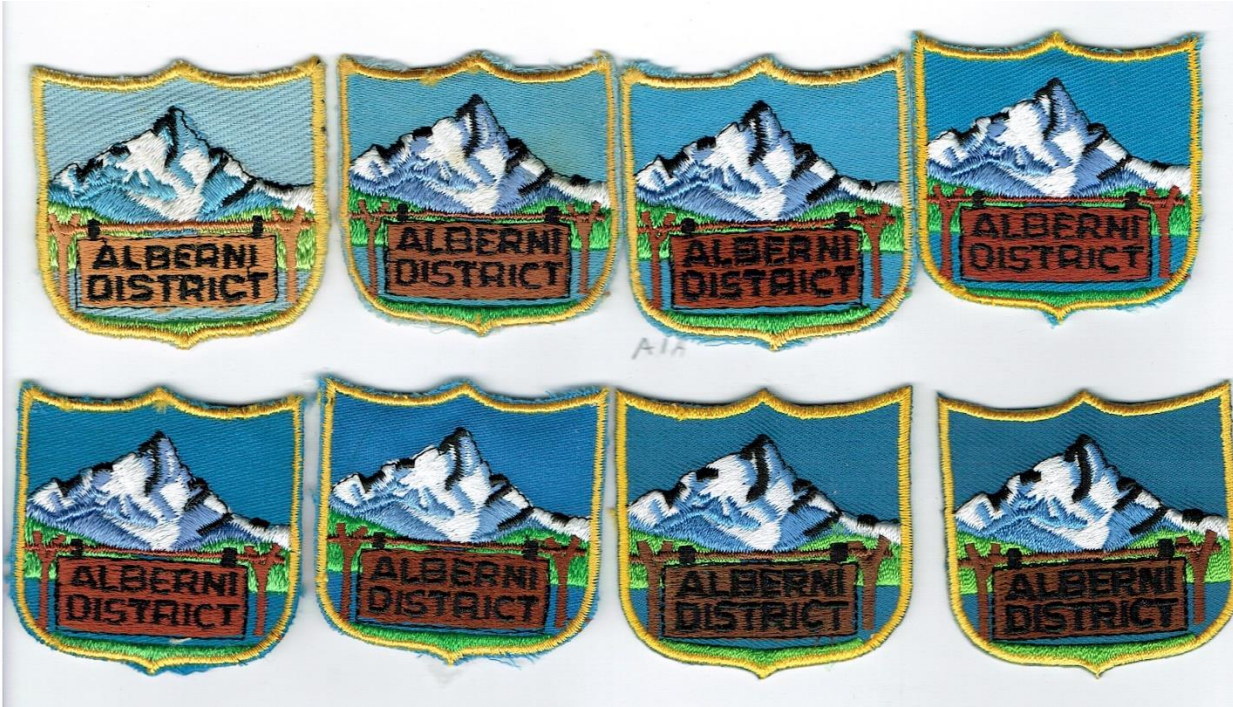


Bowman District (SASK B.4.B.) has different sized lettering as well but if you look at the bow you will also see that different runs of the badge had different bow thicknesses. The backing of the badge is also different but in Canada it is only the badge front that we pay attention to in listings.



Foremost (ALTA F.4.A.) has different shades of blue and brown that are obvious and noted in the present catalogue. But have you noticed one ear is white while the other is not? Interesting but a decision made that it is too small a part of the design for a listing.

Now I thought I would show some of my variations of Alberni District (BC A.1.A.). All are different but not listable. I have even more variations of the Mississauga (ONT M.10.A.). And Frank Smith warns me of his many Juan de Fuca badges (BC J.1.A.)! This is part of the reason we are careful about listing new varieties.
