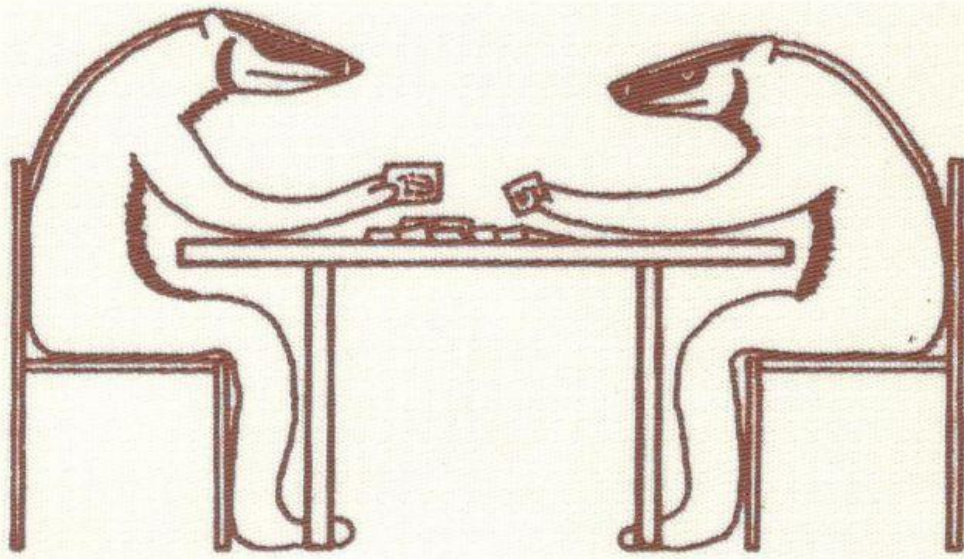

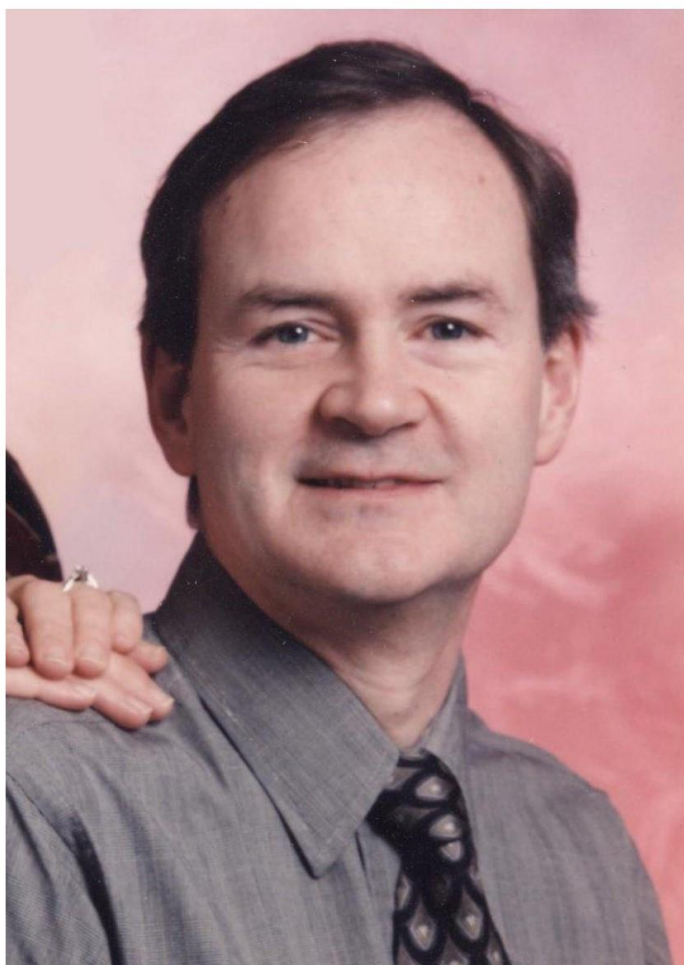
John had a great love for the outdoors; camping, hiking, and canoeing. He was never happier than when he had a chainsaw in his hands at his cottage.

In lieu of flowers, donations to the Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada are appreciated.

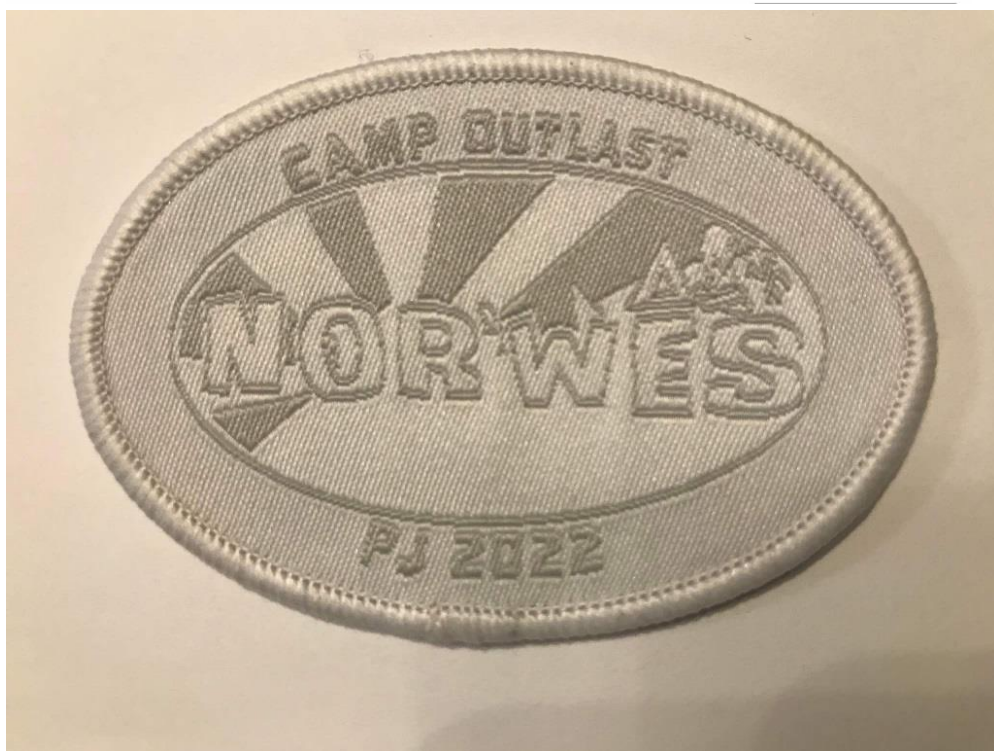
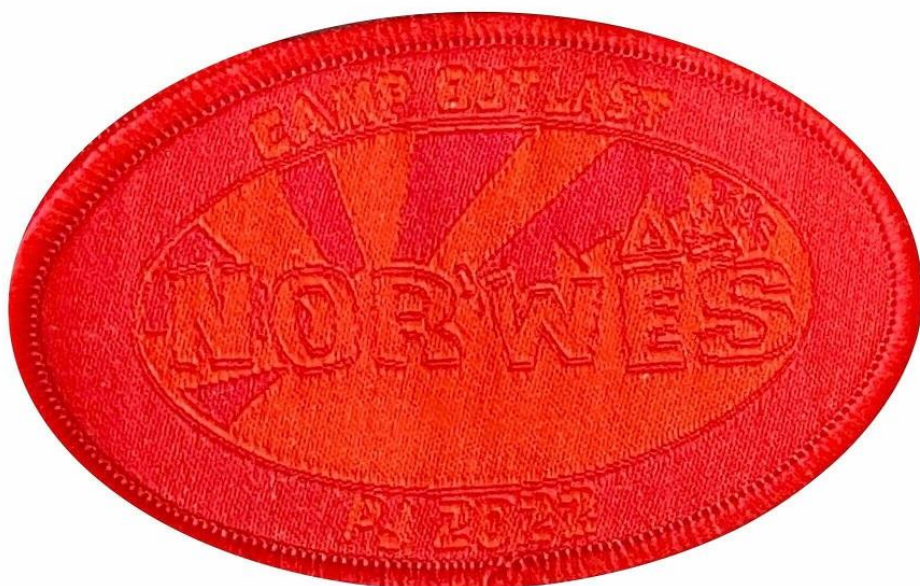

Speaking of the Victoria Museum here is a fund-raiser badge they produced.



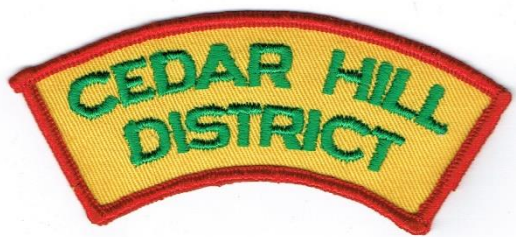
Now some pics of the museum including the official opening by Ron Bilinsky of the 30th Baden-Powell Guild and Dean Murdock the mayor of Saanich.

7. Executive Reports
 - Vice President Ralph not present, no report
 - Cataloguer, Gord thanks for support. Difficult to assume the scout shop is current badges, sizing has been challenging high def has not been consistent. Area badges not listed as extinct, national not issued official statement. New discoveries of really old badges, ie Big Creek.
 - Editor, Mike no issues doing the magazine, not much input of materials and information.
 - Webmaster Steve: forum has shown fewer discussions, most people go on Facebook page for trading. Gallery updated with Memorabilia info, speed and backup have been updated. Website good until 2025. Guide gallery available to be filled in. Edward has volunteered to help Steve with the gallery
 - Regional Reps
 - BC: Frank mentioned the loss of Bill Thow. When he passed, Frank stepped in. Thank you to all members since 2017, we have missed Montreal in 2020, 2021 and this year, Please remember lost members and friends – John Witham, Bill Thow, Ray Crowther, Karl Kern, Jack Welsh, Denny May, Glenn Margison. Life members, still with us: Reni Barlow, John Getgood, John Neysmith, Glen Wright. Please acknowledge Ralph Williams as VP for 29

years since 1993. Frank put Ralph forward as lifetime member. See new business.

- Prairies, Michael says Saskatchewan Council badge not available, Ron Schmiedge (formerly of Manitoba Scout shop) has been helping find sources (Gordon has been discussing new badges with Zone West to reproduce some of the newer badges)
- Ontario (2),
 - Chris reports Western Ontario similar to others' reports: varieties variations within runs, older issues are popping up.
 - Steve says Eastern Ontario report swap meets in Ottawa in September, London in winter and Ottawa in spring. National has stated area badges still be used, but not shown on uniform placement, not available at Scout Shop. Prediction of Councils merging.
- Quebec, Robert – groups starting to meet, Bert McArdle passed. Areas still being called areas and badges will be used. He has stock available. Registrations are climbing.

Previous brainstorming sessions resulted in merged clubs, creating the Guide Catalogue, listing non district badges. Other clubs (ie New Zealand) do local badge catalogues, reproductions with badge club name on them. Support Group memberships by more sending out of "badge baggies", local badge flag for group/area events, other poster type display material. Dave suggesting committee to explore new ideas. Maybe discuss at the Samac swap meet.

What does it do for recruitment, retention, quality of Program? Dave head of contingent for WJ Korea, SC Won't organize but says only "come home safely".

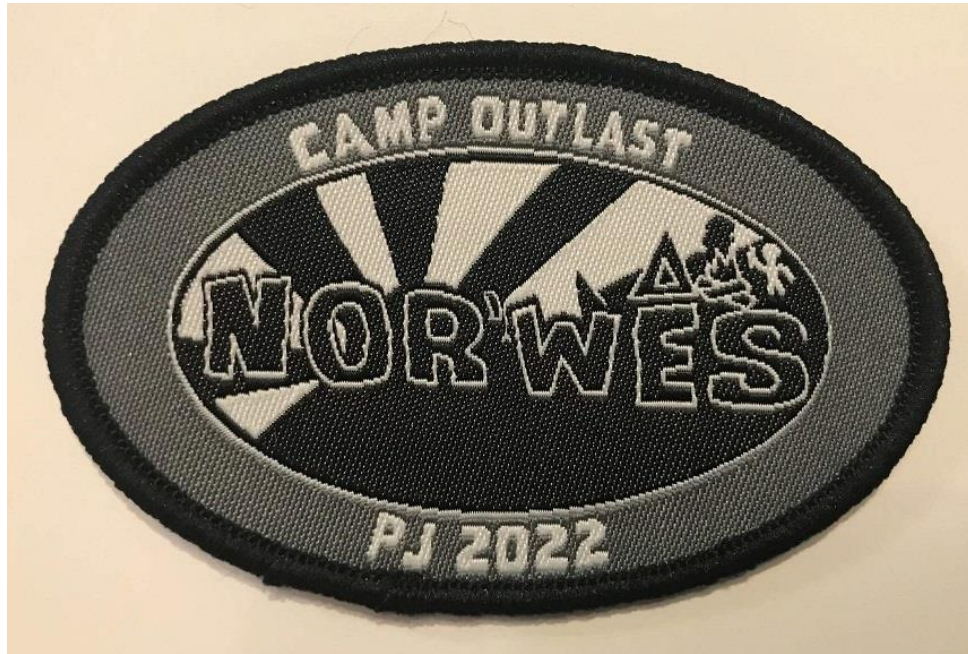
